It's been wonderful to see all the new faces and old. This week, has all been about playing and settling the children back into the routine of Nursery. So, we've dived into exciting activities like:

Building trains with our friends **Taking care of babies** in our roleplay area

We can't wait to learn, play, and have lots of fun together this term.

Class 1

The children in class 1 have done fabulously in their first full week in Reception. This week the focus has been on

getting to know each other, exploring the classroom and learning our new routines.



Class 2

Class 2 have had a brilliant first full week back, and it has been such a pleasure to see their enthusiasm and hard work. In English, the children have been inspired by our new story *Daisy Doodles*, writing their own imaginative tales about monster drawings that came to life. In Maths, we explored the different ways to make 10, while our Year 2s also investigated the relationship between counting in 1s and counting in 10s through fun exploration activities. The children also enjoyed a shape hunt in DT, spotting shapes all around us, and in History they created their very own family trees – a wonderful way to start thinking about the past and how families grow and change. It has been an exciting week, Class 2 have settled back into school life!

Class 3

Welcome back to school life. This week we have been busy getting to know each other and setting expectations for training our brains. We have explored with charcoal and created some rather messy but creative artwork, with extremely pleasing outcomes. We have also embarked on this term's hockey skills in PE too!

Class 4

Class 4 have had a brilliant start to the term!





The correlation between glue ear and language development

Glue ear happens when sticky fluid blocks part of your child's ear. This makes sounds seem muffled, like having fingers in your ears. Your child might find it harder to hear you or friends, especially when it's noisy. Listening can take lots of effort, so they may get tired, distracted, or struggle to hear words clearly. This can sometimes affect their talking and understanding.

Glue ear is very common – about 8 in 10 children in the UK will get it at some point. It often happens after a cold and usually clears up on its own within a few months.

How you can help

- Turn down background noise like the TV or music.
- Get face-to-face with your child so they can see your expressions.
- Say their name or gently touch them to get their attention before talking.
- Speak slowly and break instructions into small steps. Repeat if needed and give them extra time to respond.
- If your child says something incorrectly, repeat it back the right way as a model. For
 example, if they say "I see I!!" tat," you can say, "Yes, you see a little cat!"
- Tell your child's nursery or school so they can support them too.

Most children catch up once glue ear clears, but if it lasts a long time it can affect speech and learning new words.

If you're worried:

- Talk to your child's nursery, school, GP, or audiologist.
- Try the Progress Checker on speechandlanguage.org.uk.
- In some cases, children may need hearing aids or grommets if glue ear doesn't go away.





Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
