Prayer and Reflection

This weekend, (on 14th September) we observed the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, which celebrates two historical events: the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, in 320, and the dedication, in 335, of the basilica and shrine built on Calvary by Constantine, which mark the site of the Crucifixion.

The basilica and shrine were destroyed by the Persians in 614. The Church of the Holy sepulchre which now stands on the site was built by the crusaders in 1149.

However, the feast, more than anything else, is a celebration and commemoration of God's greatest work: his death on the Cross and His Resurrection, through which death was defeated and the doors to Heaven opened.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

begins with the prayer:
"We should glory in the cross
of our Lord Jesus Christ,
for he is our salvation,
our life and our resurrection:
through him we are saved and made free."
