School Sport Premium for the 2015/16 academic year

At St John's, we value PE and sport as playing a vital role to pupils' all round development. For many years, we have had an excellent local reputation for achievement in PE and sport, with a cabinet full of trophies to prove it!

What is Sports Premium?

The government is providing additional funds to provide new and substantial Primary School Sport Funding. At St John's we received School Sports Funding of £9,615 for the 2015/16 academic year which has enabled us to continue to develop and extend PE provision both in school hours and for extra-curricular activities.

How is St John's Primary School making the most of this funding?

To continue our relationship with the Leicester City School Sports Partnership, we invested part of the funding on becoming a Bronze member of SSPAN (The School Sport & Physical Activity Network). This membership allowed us to partake in a variety of competitions and events, especially the Sainsbury's School Games, and to continue our existing sporting and PE success.

A proportion of the funding for 2015/16, like last year, was spent on professional sports coaches teaching PE lessons and training our teachers. This enabled us to expand on our ethos of promoting a healthy lifestyle, boosting self-confidence and developing valuable life skills, all with the children's enjoyment at the heart.

The involvement of our teachers in sessions ensures that the teaching of skills to children is sustainable.

In addition, the funding allowed us to expand our equipment and resources for PE and sport in school.
