


# NEXT BINGO 10<sup>th</sup> JANUARY 2025 6.30PM IN THE VIEW

Dartmouth Academy has held lantern making workshops this month as part of the preparations for Candlelit Dartmouth at the end of November.

The workshops were open to the whole community and all materials to make a lantern were provided at the events on the 9th and 10th of November. Donations were collected to help support next year's Candlelit Dartmouth.

## Grand opening of the school's new music facility.



The Mayor of Dartmouth, Cllr Graham Webb, along with the Deputy Mayor, Cllr Graham Evans and the Town Crier, Leslie Ellis all came along to the event, with the Mayor cutting the ribbon to declare the facility officially open.

The school received funding in order to develop the new facility, which includes, hardware and software. The money was provided by the The Dart Music Festival Foundation, a charity which is dedicated to promoting music through study and education within the community.

The Dart Music Festival Foundation was set up in 2011 and is a registered charity dedicated to promoting music through study and education within our community. Music moves us, it inspires us and can be therapeutically beneficial to all. It is especially important to the Foundation to support our younger demographic in their studies, whether this be through lessons, music therapy or provision of instruments, in order to enable them to be a part of the ongoing success of the Dart Music Festival. Music, as a subject, is under threat nationally in our schools and by helping children discover their music potential, we hope to keep the ethos of 'music for all' at the heart of Dart Music Festival. This is why we felt it so important to be able to support the pupils of Dartmouth Academy, we aim to inspire the musical performers of tomorrow.

The Deputy Mayor gave a speech at the opening in which she spoke about the power of music to help people develop motor skills, emotional intelligence and the role it has to play in supporting wellbeing.

There were musical performances during the afternoon, demonstrating the talents of many Dartmouth pupils. There will be an exciting auction, as the renowned singer and songwriter David Gray had provided the school with two tickets to his upcoming concert in London to auction.

The music curriculum at Dartmouth Academy is designed to teach pupils what makes a good performance. They learn about the elements of music, instruments of the orchestra and perform regularly as a class or as a small ensemble.

Pupils are also taught how to use word-setting when composing a piece of music. They then learn how familiar

themes can be transformed using a variety of compositional techniques and study Concertos, Medieval Music and Reggae. Later in their music education, pupils compose their own Blues song, their own pop song and conclude their study by creating a mini musical or film scene as a small group.


