At Wynstream Primary School we are committed to excellence in PE, ensuring that every child values physical activity as part of a healthy lifestyle. We strive to provide outstanding provision for PE and sport across the school, and aim to give every child the opportunity to reach their full potential across a wide range of physical activities. We understand the vital importance that effective learning in PE has on the holistic development and wellbeing of every child. As such, we strive to promote healthy, active lifestyles and celebrate physical as well as academic achievement. We have previously achieved both the afPE Quality Mark for Physical Education and School Games Gold Award in recognition of the excellent PE and School Sport provision available to all pupils.

Evidenced through observation and pupil voice School exceeding the short-term target of over 80% pupils working at or above ARE for PE Establish an Active Travel scheme within the school to promote physically active travel to We are working towards a longer-term target of 85% of pupils working at or above ARE and from school and increase opportunities for pupils to be active during the school day The school has consistently performed well within local inter-school competitions, including: 2016-17= 12 first place finishes, 2 second place finishes, 9 third place finishes (23 medal finishes) 2017-18= 35 competitions attended, 12 first place finishes, 8 second place finishes, 8 third place finishes (28 medal finishes) 2018/19= 37 competitions attended, 15 first place finishes, 7 second place finishes, 6 third place finishes (28 medal finishes) 2019/20= 19 competitions attended in Autumn and Spring terms, 6 first place finishes & 3 third place finishes (9 medal finishes) \*competition participation effected by COVID. 2021/22 = 9 competitions attended in the year, 3 1st place finishes, 1 silver place finish & 2 bronze place finishes. PE specialists have created, organised and delivered a inter school football competition called the 'Exeter Primary Football League', which was in its sixth year of running and has had 24 teams competing regularly across three groups for the last 3 years-giving over 240 pupils from Exeter and the surrounding areas the opportunity to access regular competitive school football.


