Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Sacred	To have a connection with religion and be holy.
Bible/testaments	The sacred book which Christians read. The old and new testament are the two main sections of the bible.
Qur'an	The sacred book followed by Muslims.
Humanist	Someone who believes in humanism and does not believe that people need a God or religion to meet their spiritual and moral needs.
Atheist	Someone who does not believe on any God or Gods.
Trinity	A group of three things or people.
Messiah	A leader who is believed to have the power to solve world problems.
Trimurti	A Hindu belief of three gods: Brahman, Vishnu and Shiva.
Kaaba	Cube shaped building in the centre of the mosque in Mecca.
