

What we expect from parents / carers:	What you can expect from us:
As a parent, you are legally responsible for making sure your child gets a suitable fulltime education.	Celebration of excellent student attendance and punctuality on a weekly and termly basis in assemblies with a variety of rewards and recognition.
To help your child attend as much school as possible, you can: Promote positive and healthy attendance patterns with your child and set good bedtime and morning routines.	
Ensure your child arrives at school every day, on time and equipped and ready to learn.	An onsite Attendance Team dedicated to working with students, families and staff to improve attendance each and every day.
Ensure we have at least three up-to-date addresses and telephone numbers so we can contact you quickly when required	A pastoral team to carry out pastoral work with students in raising their attainment and achieving their full potential.
Report absence via school app before 8:30am each day until your child returns to school. Aim for medical appointments to be made outside of school time.	Counselling service that children can access (waiting lists apply)
Avoid making holiday requests during term time	
Contact school if you are experiencing difficulty getting your child to attend school.	
Work with the school and any other agencies of support to resolve any difficulties which may affect regular school attendance.	

New attendance legislation: Sherdley will adopt from 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024

Holidays during term time will not be authorised.

Parents can request 'Leave of Absence' in exceptional circumstances. Evidence of this will be required to support any decision made by the head teacher.

Thresholds for Penalty Notice have changed. Reduced to 5 days / 10 sessions (am/pm/late after the close of register) in a 10 week period. Fines are £160 per parent, per child. Reducing to £80 if paid within 21 days.

Second year, if a Penalty Notice is issued, the fine is  $\pounds 160$  with no option to reduce.

Third year – the family will be legally prosecuted.
