# **Holidays In Term Time**

Can I please remind you that current legislation makes it clear that headteachers *cannot grant approval for term-time holidays*. Only in exceptional circumstances may leave of absence be granted and authorised.

Any requests should be on an official school absence request form and handed into the school office for consideration prior to any holiday/leave arrangements being made. If term-time holidays are taken without submitting a leave of absence form, the school office will send you the appropriate paperwork to be completed *retrospectively*.

Each application will be considered individually and unless the request is an **exceptional circumstance**, the absence will not be authorised.

It is my duty to share the following information in relation to term-time holidays.

It is the responsibility of the local authority to decide when to issue fines to parents, meaning the process varies from council to council. Under the national rules, all schools are required to consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons. From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.

Our approach to improving attendance for pupils at William Gilbert School is always to work together with parents in a supportive way when there are attendance concerns.

## **School Uniform**

A reminder that when we return after half term the full winter William Gilbert uniform is compulsory and summer options are no longer permitted. Please remember boots are <u>not</u> part of our uniform and girls may wear navy, grey or black opaque tights or white knee socks. Full details can be found on our website. There will be a further letter coming out this week to share results from the recent PE Kit consultation with parents, pupils and staff.
