pier	a platform on pillars projecting from the shore into the sea
port	a place at the edge of an ocean, river or lake where ships load and unload their cargo
town	a large settlement with houses, schools and sometimes a railway station and shopping centre
village	a settlement with a small number of houses usually in a country area
