# CLASS ‘SNAPPY’ NEWS

## “New skills”

### Nursery

We've had a lovely week talking all about our families! The children enjoyed sharing who's in their family, drawing family pictures, and telling us all about the pictures from home. We're learning independence! Children have been practicing pouring their own drinks and even helping to wash up after snack time. It's been wonderful hearing the children chatting about their families, showing how proud and confident they are. We're making new friends, sharing toys, and learning how to take turns — great big steps in settling into life.



### Class 1

The children have been enjoying playing with new friends and are becoming more and more familiar with all the new routines of Class 1. They have all painted a self portrait for our class display and created a mini clay face. This week we have looked at lovely photos from home to find out about all things the children like doing with their families - looking after pets, going to the beach, riding, camping, swimming, crabbing, baking, seeing relatives... Wow, they are busy!



### Class 2

This week, Class 2 have been busy exploring their creativity and learning in lots of exciting ways. The children experimented with oil pastels, trying out different techniques to colour in the spirals they designed. In English, we have been diving into our story *Daisy Doodles*, learning the meanings of new words and bringing the story to life through role play, which the children really enjoyed.

In maths, we have been using a variety of manipulatives to build and understand numbers from 0–20. Our Year 2 children also rose to a new challenge brilliantly, as they used Sparx Maths for the very first time!

### Class 3

This week in Class 3, we have explored electricity – where it comes from and which gadgets use mains power or batteries. In PE, we kicked off our invasion games, practising catching and throwing in Rugby. In Maths, we've been flexibly partitioning numbers to build strong problem-solving skills. In English, our imaginations soared as we learned to care for creatures – even dragons!

### Class 4

Class 4 have had a great week of learning! In science, we explored electricity and found out how to stay safe around it. In geography, we've been learning about informal settlements and what life might be like in them. We've also kept active in PE, working hard to sharpen our football and basketball skills, and the children are showing real progress and teamwork.

### Class 5

What a great week! We have ordered and compared numbers, dealing with numbers to 10,000,000 and all the way down to below zero. In English, we have been learning to improve our grammar within sentences; expanding our noun phrases, adding adverbials and linking with conjunctions. We have been lucky enough to have two visitors this week, so we have enjoyed learning more about biodiversity and also farming. We have started our history learning about World War II and the impact it had on life at that time and afterwards.

## Forest School Adventures – Welcoming Autumn

As cooler air settles in and the leaves begin to fall, our Forest School has fully embraced the beauty and change that autumn brings. The children have been exploring and talking about the magical transformation of our trees, noticing the golden, red, and orange leaves starting to appear on the forest school floor.

This week, we learned all about the difference between deciduous trees, which shed their leaves in autumn, and evergreen trees, which stay green all year round.

In true Forest School fashion, we got hands – on with nature, creating leaf mobiles, building dens and tarp shelters, and keeping warm while chatting about the changing weather. The children noticed how the breeze is cooler now, and how some days the sky feels just a bit heavier with the promise of rain.

We also shared a heartwarming story about a little fox who tried to catch the falling leaves, hoping to save them from the wind. Though he couldn't stop autumn from arriving, he learned that change can be beautiful – and that letting go is part of nature's rhythm. The story sparked lovely conversations about feelings, change, and the seasons.

Through all these activities, we continue to nurture curiosity, resilience, and a deep love for the natural world. Autumn may mean saying goodbye to summer, but out in the 'forest', it opens the door to wonder, learning, and connection.

## MUSIC

This week has seen class 2 move on with their understanding and application of their skills using chime bars and glockenspiels. The children learned to read a graphic score and play together from it, focussing on dynamics.

Class 3 have also progressed with their practical skills and understanding of reading a simple traditional music score and learning what the different markings mean. They then practiced what they had learnt using recorders and ocarinas.

Class 4 totally aced ukuleles and glockenspiels this week and put those skills into action. Both strumming patterns and chord changes in both instruments saw a marked improvement by the end of the lesson.

## **Introducing Our Newly Elected School Captains and Vice Captains**

This week, our newly elected School Captains and Vice Captains met for the very first time to begin their journey as leaders of our school community. Their first mission is an exciting one: to research and choose a selection of charities – both local and national – that they feel passionate about supporting over the coming year. At the next Family Group meeting, they will present their ideas, explain why each charity is important, and invite everyone to take part in a vote to decide which causes our school will champion together.

Being a School Captain is both an honour and a responsibility. The role involves setting an example for others, representing the school at key events, and giving a voice to the children in our community. Alongside the House Captains, they will also be asked to contribute to Children's Voice, helping to bring about positive changes both within school and in the wider community.

Our Vice Captains will play a vital supporting role, stepping in to lead when needed and working closely with the Captains to ensure that projects run smoothly. They will share responsibility for organising events, encouraging participation across the school, and making sure every voice is heard. Just like the Captains, they are role models for others and will have the opportunity to develop valuable skills in leadership, teamwork, and communication.

Together, the Captains and Vice Captains are eager to make a real difference – not only through fundraising but also by raising awareness of issues that matter. This year promises to be an exciting one, filled with opportunities for them to grow in confidence while making a meaningful contribution to school life and the wider community.

Something very exciting has begun at Blackawton School! We have launched a whole-school project to make our school grounds more colourful, wildlife-friendly, and full of biodiversity.

We were joined by Claire Matheson from Little GREEN Change, a brilliant organisation that helps schools and communities across the UK learn about the environment and take action to protect it. Claire spent the day with us, helping everyone get involved in making our own “little green change.”

Children in Classes 1, 2 and 3 rolled up their sleeves to plant daffodils and crocuses, which will burst into colour in spring and give hungry bees and pollinators something tasty to enjoy. We also launched our brand-new “no mow” area on the stage field, which will become a safe and beautiful home for wildflowers and insects.

To celebrate the start of this project, our new school captains had the special job of planting two pear trees—something that will grow alongside our school and provide fruit for years to come!

The whole school then came together for an assembly, where Claire taught us about plants, pollinators, and the simple things we can all do to care for the planet.

This is just the beginning of our journey to make Blackawton School a more nature-friendly place. We can't wait to see our flowers bloom, our pear trees grow, and our wildlife thrive!





## Farmwise visited KS2

Children in Classes 4 and 5 were lucky enough to have a visit from Farmwise on Wednesday. They enjoyed learning about farming in Devon; the magical feeling of getting muddy hands and understanding that milk doesn't just appear in the fridge. All children had the opportunity to milk a cow (sadly not a real one) and churn their own butter. They also learned about cereals before grinding wheat into flour. They had a good go at doing this and the classrooms will never look the same again! Their favourite part of the experience was sampling their homemade butter on a delicious scone at the end of it all.

## Should I keep my child off school?

### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

### No
