Subject Specific Vocabulary

country	an area of land controlled by one government (the people who make laws and rule)
capital city	the main place where a country's government meets
United Kingdom	a country in Europe made up of 4 parts: England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales
landmark	something, easy to see and recognise from a distance, which can help you work out where you are (often of historical importance)
aerial view	a bird's eye view of a place, usually seen on maps
population	the number of people living in a country, city or area
physical feature	natural things, like seas, rivers and mountains They would be here even if there were no people around.
human feature	things like houses, roads and bridges They have been built by people.
urban	a place where thousands of people live and there are lots of buildings
rural	an open area of land, with few homes or other buildings and not many people
