



- EYFS Early Years Foundation Stage





A typical day in Reception





Arriving in the morning

Children will enter the school through the main doors at the front of the new building.

There will always to two members of staff on the door to speak to if you need to.

Doors will close at 8:55am. Please don't be late!

Mornings

• We would like you to leave your child at the main door, encouraging them to enter the classroom areas <u>on their own</u>.



- We assess the children on their independence so please help us with this at home before the start of the school year:
- Practise putting on a coat and shoes. Please name <u>all</u> clothing
- Encourage them to hang things up

Our classrooms

We have three separate classrooms. All classrooms have a creative area for all our budding artists and designers! We have construction, small world toys, a writing station, a reading nook, investigation space and much more!

Maths



Maths is an important part of learning in our day and receiving a good grounding in maths is an essential life skill. We dedicate time for children to learn mathematics and integrate mathematics throughout the day. We use manipulatives and representations to develop understanding. We ensure that teaching builds on what children already know.

Forest Friday Sessions

We put on our wellies and head to our fantastic forest area every Friday to explore the woodland. We build dens, climb trees, light fires and drink hot chocolate!

Hugglescote Primary School is a healthy school. We offer free fruit and milk at break times.

Your child can bring their own water bottle into school every day. Make sure it has their name written on it so it doesn't get mixed up. Lunch time

Your child will enjoy some delicious food at lunchtime

Your child will spend lunchtime with their friends and our lunchtime supervisor ladies. Each day they will be able to choose between 3 delicious and nutritious options. Your child can also bring their named own packed lunch if you'd prefer.

Home time



- Our doors will open at <u>3.10pm</u> (to allow you to collect older siblings for 3.15pm)
- You will collect your child from directly outside their classroom.



- We <u>must</u> know who is collecting your child.
- If you need to come back into school for any reason, you will be asked to wait until the rest of the Foundation Stage children have been handed over.

Reading

<u>What you can expect from us:</u>

- Your child will be heard read by an adult <u>at least</u> once a week.
- Lots of opportunities to enjoy book sharing
- Decodable 'reading books' closely matched to your child's phonics skills, plus a free choice book.
- Comments in the Reading Record on how to support your child further at home (next steps in reading).
 <u>What we hope to expect from you</u>:
- Hear your child read at home every day if possible (minimum of 3 times per week)
- Record your book sharing times in your child's Reading Record and sign.
- Promote a love of reading.





Assessment and reporting progress

During your child's first few weeks at school, we will make a baseline assessment of them against the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile. This helps us to plan their learning.



During the Autumn term, we hold Parents' Evenings where we formally explain how your child is progressing and what their next steps are. During the Spring Term, you will receive a Mid Year report to show the progress your child has made. During late Spring, we will invite you to attend a second Parents' Evening. In the Summer term, we will send you an End of Year Report for you child, which details how they have attainted against the Early Learning Goals and if they have achieved GLD 'A Good Level of Development.' We talk to parents all year round, informally, about how children are doing and how they have settled. You'll have access to 'Tapestry' – an online Learning Journey where you can access your child's learning on a daily basis.



Your children will need

- Book bag for letters and reading books
- Wellies & raincoat to remain in school
- PE bag with PE Kit
- Lunchbox if your child is having packed lunches
- Fruit and water is provided
- Milk register at coolmilk.com
- Please ensure that names are in **EVERYTHING**!
- A warm coat and hat send a coat EVERY DAY

Communication Is Important - WEDUC

- With Weduc you will be able to receive/send messages to and from your child's class teacher, view key dates/events and keep up to date with our school news and other important announcements.
