

School Attendance - Ongoing Reporting.

The information below shows that whole school attendance for the dates between 6th September 2021 and 26th May 2022 is currently 91.7%, slightly up from when we reported 1 week ago. This is going in the right direction, but is still below the expected attendance rate of 96% or higher. The national average for attendance in state funded primary schools was 92.3% to April 2022, Wynstream Primary School is 0.6% below this national average.

COVID-19 Information


Current government guidance suggests that Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under who have a positive COVID 19 test the advice will be 3 days.
