CLASS 'SNAPPY' NEWS

"Starting term off with a bang!"

Nursery

We've had sounds of Ooooh!, Aaah, Bang, Pop! This week getting ready for Bonfire night. We have all enjoyed a trip down to the bonfire and was amazed how big it looks already. We've been singing songs about fireworks and pretending to be rockets and sparklers with some great movements. We've also

learnt how to keep safe during firework/bonfire night too.



Class 1

This week has gone with a whizz, pop, bang and sizzle.....Class 1 has enjoyed exploring Bonfire Night and all the sounds, colours and movement that it brings. It was exciting to walk to the park on Thursday and check up on the preparations for our village bonfire this weekend.



Class 2

We have settled right back into amazing learning in Class 2 this week.

We have completed our unit in maths on addition and subtraction and now are exploring the place value of numbers from 0 to 100. We are loving using boardgames to practise counting and exploring numbers in their tens and ones.

In English we have explored the past and present tense as verb detectives.

In PE we have started our new sports of netball and tag rugby.

Class 3

Class 3 have been very busy this week! We've just started our new Maths unit all about addition and subtraction. Everyone is working hard to practise new strategies! In English, we have been writing our own stories about Lennox visiting England, using the same style as the book *Gregory Cool*. Our stories are full of great conversations adding speech to move the story forward. In History, we've been learning about why the Anglo-Saxons created their own villages and how they didn't use the old Roman buildings after the Romans left Britain. To bring our learning to life, we even made our own mini Anglo-Saxon villages in creative dioramas, understanding everyone worked together and did their bit! In PE, we had a great time playing netball — even though we got completely soaked in the rain! Everyone joined in with big smiles and brilliant teamwork, making it a PE lesson to remember. It's been a fantastic (and very fizzy!) start to the term!

Class 4

This week in Science, Class 4 have begun learning all about the digestive system and the fascinating role that saliva plays in helping us break down food. The children have enjoyed exploring how our bodies process what we eat and have been making some exciting discoveries along the way!

In Maths, we've been investigating prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers, deepening our understanding of how these special types of numbers are connected.

It's been a busy and engaging start to the term, with plenty of curiosity and enthusiasm in every lesson!

Class 5

Class 5 have had a great first week back.

We have seen the results of our most recent tie-dying and agree that we have upskilled ourselves ready for the final piece now. We have also enjoyed portrait drawing and getting down to the finer details of drawing the intricate parts of the human eye.

In maths, we have been looking at the order or calculations and how it makes a difference between getting it right and getting it wrong.

We have also started our final drafts of adventure story writing.

This week at Forest School, we've been sparkling with creativity and adventure! Our little explorers celebrated Fireworks Week with a bang — quite literally (in spirit, of course).



How to grow a crocus:

Crocus bulbs should be planted from September to December. to allow roots to develop before winter. Plant them about 3-4 inches (8-10 cm) deep in well-drained soil, with the pointed side facing up. Planting time can extend as late as December, as long as the ground isn't frozen.

We have purchased a new bird feeding station, to encourage different birds to our grounds ahead of Bird Watching Week 2026. If you have any feeders you would like to donate to the school, please do drop them into the school office.



How many triangles can you count?




Miss Burt's Recommended Read:

Music News

Class 1 have begun learning about musical pitch, and had lots of fun tracing Sammy the Snake with their voices.

Class 2 have started learning about instrument families and the different sounds that different types of instruments make.

This week our learning was based on the story of Peter and the Wolf. We will listen to various genres of Christmas music and discover some of the many different styles and sounds of the season.

Class 3 are increasing their bank of notes on recorders and ocarinas. This will lead to playing a little something Christmassy as the weeks go by.

One group of KS2 children are tackling song-writing this term, whilst the other group are forging ahead with playing as an ensemble. They are building on skills learnt last term and understanding how chords play a part in accompanying songs. Glockenspiels allow the children to visualise the chord and choose which notes of the chord they wish to play. Both groups will play/sing seasonal pieces by Christmas.

Simple ways to enjoy the festive season without overspending

Christmas can be a great time to relax and spend time with family, but it often comes with extra costs and pressure to spend more than we'd like. With household budgets already stretched, a bit of planning can make a real difference.

1. Set a Realistic Budget

Work out what you can comfortably afford to spend and stick to it. It's easy for small extras to add up, so keep a list of what you need — and what you don't. If you can, set aside a small amount each week to spread the cost.

2. Keep Gifts Simple

Children often remember the fun and attention more than what's under the tree. Lowcost or homemade <u>gifts</u>, <u>or</u> pooling together for a "Secret Santa" within the family, can keep things fair and affordable for everyone.

3. Plan Food Carefully

Christmas dinner doesn't need to be over the top. Planning meals in advance helps avoid waste, and sharing the cooking with friends or relatives can save both time and money.

4. Make the Most of What's Local

There are plenty of free or low-cost events in Teignbridge over the festive period from school fairs to community activities. These can be a great way to get into the Christmas spirit without spending much.

5. Don't Feel Pressured

It's fine to say no to things that stretch your budget. A walk to see the lights, a film night at home, or a board game with family can make just as good memories as anything that costs money.



Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek


