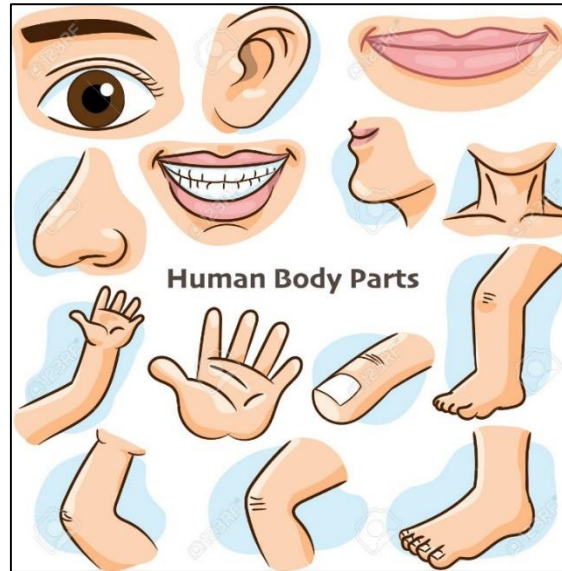


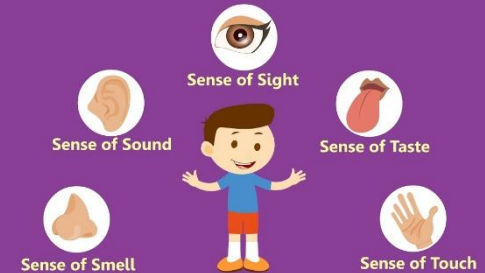
Year 1 Knowledge Organiser: Animals and Humans

VOCABULARY

Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mothers' milk
Birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings
Fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scales and fins to help them swim. They breathe through gills
Reptiles	All reptiles breathe air and have scales on their skin
Amphibians	Amphibians live in water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy, skin
Carnivores	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat)
Herbivores	Animals that only eat plants
Omnivores	Animals that eat both plants and other animals

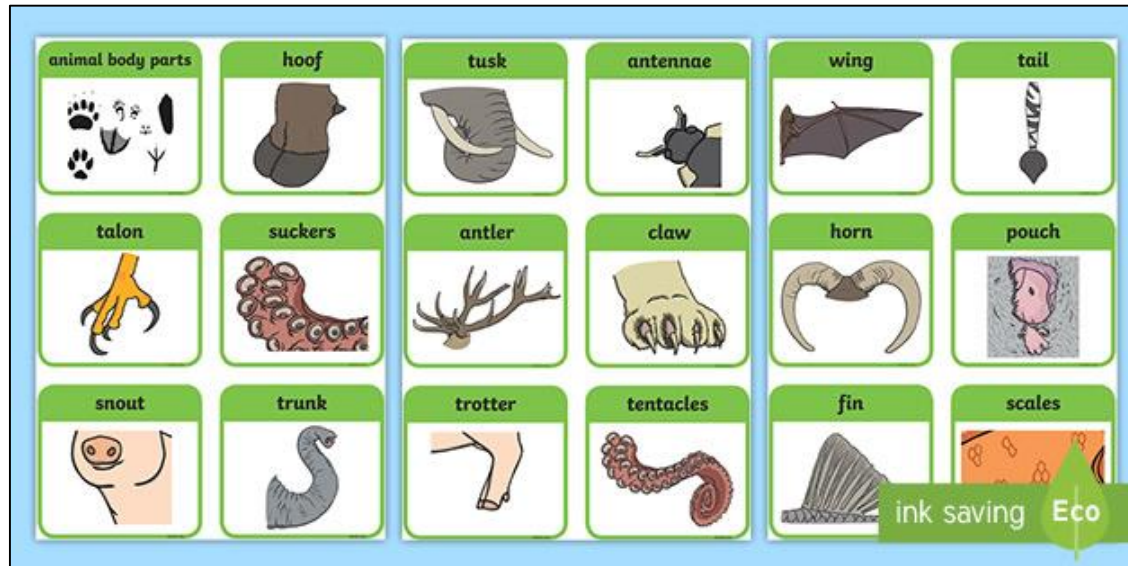

The 5 senses

Hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you
Touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch – you can tell if something is warm, cold, rough smooth etc...
Taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You might have some tastes you don't like
Smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can usually tell if something is nice or not nice
Sight	Your eyes let you see all things around you
