## 16-19 Tuition funding

The Government has extended the 16 to 19 tuition fund which is a £96 million of one-off funding for the 2021 to 2022 academic year. It is ring fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 providers to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

The guidance related to the fund means that only learners who do not have 5-9 passes in either or both English and Maths GCSE at the end of KS4 can be supported by this fund. The Fund is not limited to supporting GCSE Maths and English but can be for any aim in the learner's programme of study.

The need for support will be determined and agreed between the eligible learners and staff

Typically support will be in the form of small group or individual tuition over and above the teaching timetabled for that subject. At Teign the funding will be used to employ a staff member who will be used to provide individual and small group support for identified students. This support will include study skills development and mentoring to support students with disrupted learning due to COVID-19. These will typically be 1 to 1 study skills sessions to support academic progress and will include vocational and academic skills and learning that are import for preparation for adulthood as well as subject specific development.
