Dear Parents and Carers of Year 6 Students,

I wanted to take this opportunity to get in touch and let you know how excited we are about our new year 7 students joining us following the summer holidays. We hope you have all had a great Easter break and are looking forward to the summer term ahead with leavers events, residentials and much more no doubt.

Below is some information regarding the upcoming transition process that you may find useful and some key dates for the diary.

Transition Days:

We are excited to welcome your child to KEVICC and look forward to them seeing what being part of the KEVICC school community is all about. Our transition days are an important part of the transition process, as they provide an opportunity for your child to become familiar with the school layout, routines and most importantly, they get to meet important people that will support them throughout their KEVICC journey.

- Transition days will take place on **Monday the 29th June and Tuesday the 30th of June**
- Students will need to arrive for 9am at the Ariel Theatre and will need to be collected at 3pm from Elmhirst car park on the Astro turf side of the road (Unless you have signed for your child to walk home) A member of staff will walk students to the elmhirst car park at the end of the college day.
- Students are able to wear their new KEVICC or primary uniform. Students will need to bring with them basic equipment such as pen, pencil, ruler and rubber. We also ask that students bring a water bottle they can use throughout the day and sun cream if required.

As part of our safeguarding measures, if any students are walking to and from college by themselves or with siblings, we will need parent/carer consent. Your child will not be allowed to leave school site alone unless we have your consent. Please complete the link if your child is making their own way home. **This is NOT needed if they are being collected.** [Transport for KEVICC transition days 2026 – Fill in form](#). We will not let any student leave college site unless this has been provided due to safeguarding reasons.

Food and Drink on Transition Days:

All students will receive a snack and small drink at break time each day, to try some of the food on offer at the college. **Please ensure your child has a packed lunch and a drinks bottle for the day as they will not be able to purchase food in college until September.**

Tutor Groups:

We will always aim to pair students up with primary school and parent recommendations when creating tutor groups. However, sometimes this is not always possible. On the transition days students will be in their tutor group throughout the two days but will have opportunities to mix with other students. Making new friendships is exciting, but we recognise it can also be a nervous time for some students. **It is important to be aware, when students join us in September their timetabled lessons are not structured in tutor groups and students will find that they will have lessons with a variety of people, which we hope will help them develop new friendships.**

Meet the Tutor Evening:

On the afternoon of Tuesday 30th of June, starting at 4pm, we will be holding an informal meet the tutor evening. This will enable parents/carers the opportunity to meet your child's tutor alongside other key pastoral staff. Tutors are the first point of contact and will be a friendly face each morning to meet and greet students. There will also be members of the SEND team available to speak to parents, where additional support may be required for your child. This evening is very informal and just an opportunity to ask questions and be able to put a face to a name. Siblings are welcome to join families as we know child care can be difficult.

Adopted Children:

We would like to make Parents of adopted children aware that there is additional funding for schools to support the education of children adopted from care. This funding offers increased support that could be significant and greatly enhance access to opportunities. All information will be treated in the strictest confidence.
