Lead Learning Partner Review

We are delighted with our Hampshire Lead Learning Partner Report. LLPs carry out annual visits each year in schools to audit and review the quality of education, behaviour and attitudes, personal development and leadership and management. Below are some short excerpts from the report:

'...of teaching and learning observed, pupils are highly engaged and hang on the words of the teachers. This is because teachers have clear expectations of the learning, the learning behaviours and ensure that the learning tasks are enticing. They have also enabled the learning environments so that pupils can access concrete resources to support their thinking...teachers clearly identify the learning, unpick this with the pupils with clarity and simplicity, and understand how to use their assessment for learning effectively to ensure pupils receive work that is correctly targeted for improvement.'

'Leaders of the school continue to hold safeguarding in the highest regard.'

'Learning support assistants (LSAs) are used to excellent effect, either contributing through questioning, leading smaller group sessions, or simply in quietly re-engaging pupils who need further support.'

'Subject leaders understand the strengths and areas for development within their subject area. This has been through book looks, pupil conferencing and where possible, observing teaching...subject leaders have worked hard to ensure that learning is being tailored to meet the



needs of the pupils in class. They have identified the steps in knowledge that pupils need to acquire and have reviewed and adapted the curriculum planning to secure this.'

Our next steps are to further develop enabled learning environments, including working walls, so that pupils can clarify their thinking.

D-Day Commemoration

Our Year 5 and Year 6 children took part in the village D-Day Commemoration Service. Our Upper Key Stage 2 children have recently been learning about D-Day and have used their learning to write some outstanding compositions which are extremely engaging to read. Well done children and thank you to Jason Hart from the British Legion for organising.
