# CLASS 'SNAPPY' NEWS

"A taste of Harvest"

#### **Nursery**

This week, our nursery children have been digging into the world of seasonal vegetables! We've had great fun retelling the story of The Enormous Carrot (with a twist on the traditional Enormous Turnip) – complete with actions and lots of laughter!

Our role-play area has transformed into a vibrant vegetable shop, where children have enjoyed "buying" and "selling" pumpkins, carrots, and more – great for language and maths skills!

We've been learning all about pumpkins – inside and out – and discovering how vegetables grow in different seasons. The highlight of the week was making our own vegetable soup! The children practised their peeling and cutting skills safely and carefully, and of course, loved tasting their delicious, warm soup afterwards.



#### Class 1

Class 1's activities have been based around the theme of Autumn Harvest this week.

They have been enjoying the traditional tale of The Enormous Turnip, acting the story

out in groups and drawing fantastic pictures to show all the characters. Thanks to a bumper harvest of apples we have all been able to crush apples and to make delicious apple juice to take home. The children decided that this is probably much tastier than turnip juice!



### Class 2

Class 2 have explored the "ingenious and hilarious" book, mixed up fairy tales.

We have discussed what makes this book so funny and have understood its structure in preparation for creating our own class mixed up fairy tale next week.

Continuing our unit of addition and subtraction in maths we have been doubling this week and creating addition stories.

### Class 3

Class 3 have had a very exciting start to their new unit in English! We have begun reading *Gregory Cool*, a story about a little boy who travels to the island of Tobago. Gregory finds himself in a new and unfamiliar place, and we have been exploring what it might feel like to visit somewhere so different. The children have really enjoyed discussing Gregory's adventures and thinking about how he adapts to island life.

We also had a fantastic **Apple Day!** The class learned about how apples are pressed to make juice and got to see (and taste!) the process in action. It was great fun watching the apples being turned into delicious, fresh juice.

What a busy and brilliant week for Class 3!

#### Class 4

It's been another exciting week in Class 4!

In history, we explored the world of the Anglo-Saxons, handling real artefacts and uncovering fascinating clues about life in the past. In science, we became investigators, testing a range of materials to find out which ones were insulators and which were conductors. There were plenty of surprises and lots of great scientific thinking along the way!

#### Class 5

Class 5 have had the wonderful opportunity to learn some life skills this week. Their behaviour was exemplary and they listened well to speakers from all of the different stations, including; Lifeguards, Police, Fire Service, First Aid, Electricity and Gas Safety. They also had chance to learn about healthy life choices with some 'Sound Meditation.' We were so relaxed! Children also learnt about Hoax calls and the impact this can have on others, who are in need. After a lunch break filled with games run by Dartmouth Academy PE Ambassadors, they took part in a Swimming Gala. We were so proud of the supportive and caring attitudes they had towards their peers - great cheering on and some fantastic wins!





#### **Forest School Focus:**

#### Prickles, Autumn Days and Happy Hearts - Forest School News

This week's Forest School sessions were inspired by an exciting wildlife discovery — a baby hedgehog spotted on School Lane last week!

We talked about what to do if you find a hedgehog out during the day, and the children's thoughtful responses showed just how much they care about animals. It was lovely to hear that even our youngest pupils knew that hedgehogs are nocturnal and that if one is out in daylight, it might need help. Many children mentioned *Prickles in a Pickle*, a fantastic local rescue that helps hedgehogs in trouble.

We also discussed how hedgehogs are lactose intolerant (no milk, please!) and how cutting a small hole in garden fences can help create "hedgehog highways," allowing these much-loved mammals to travel safely in search of beetles, earwigs, and caterpillars.

As the seasons begin to shift, we've noticed a chill in the air and darker mornings and evenings. Change is in the air, but one thing that remains constant is the value of outdoor play. This week, every year group embraced time outside. The mud kitchen was a hub of creativity and imagination, while tyres and wooden planks became the building blocks of brilliant construction projects.

It's been another wonderful week of learning, playing, and connecting with nature in our beautiful Forest School area.

# New Health Resources from CFHD for Children and Young People with Learning Disabilities



#### **Road Safety Reminder**

Due to a recent road closure, there has been an increase in traffic through French Furze. Members of the community have noticed that some vehicles are travelling at significant speed through the estate and are concerned for the safety of all pedestrians, especially the children.

#### **HEAD LICE**

#### Please check your child's hair!



It is important to regularly check your child's hair for head lice. The best technique is to use a head lice comb when the hair is wet, leaving in conditioner and combing the hair in sections. When the hair is wet, head lice cannot move so they are easier to comb out. Please note that they do not jump or fly, you can only catch head lice from head to head contact. If you find head lice, please treat appropriately: the wet combing technique eradicates the lice and eggs. This should be done every 3 to 4 days over a 2-week period to break the life cycle. #### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
