#### **Saplings**

The children have settled back into nursery really well. We have been talking about families and who lives in our house.

A couple of children have had some exciting news of new additions to their families over the summer. We would like to enhance our home corner to enable more roleplay this term. If anyone has an old dial telephone, a Standard lamp, Adult dressing up hats (straw hats ,Boaters ,flat caps or occasion hats) Lightweight scarves or magnetic catch necklaces etc we would love to give them a new home!

#### **Beech**

Beech Class have settled well into the new term. The reception children have enjoyed the company of their older buddies and are quickly getting used to the school routines.

We have observed the children in the 'doctors', playing with trains and construction and getting muddy outside. We have talked about families using the story, 'Once there were giants' and made huge spiral pictures. Mr Barrett and I feel very fortunate to have the most brilliant class. Thank you, Mrs Partridge.

#### **Hazel**

Hazel class have had an exciting first full week back. In Geography, we started our work on maps - looking at line of latitude and longitude on a globe.



In music, we used a variety of instruments to create a call-and-response rhythm.

We enjoyed reading Gregory Cool, re-told the story and used drama to understand the character's feelings. In Science, we have been thinking nutrition and what makes a balanced meal. We are excited to have sandpits outside the classroom now and are starting to use these to extend our math's learning about place value and shape.

#### Willow

Willow Class have made a fantastic start to the term! In maths, we've begun exploring place value and have been revising our Roman Numerals – our challenge is to try and spot them in everyday life.

In science, we have begun our work on 'Forces' and have researched and written some brilliant fact files on the life of Sir Isaac Newton, discovering how he came to understand the laws of gravity.

The dry weather meant we could get outside for netball; we practised our balls skills and worked hard to keep that landing foot firmly on the ground! In art, we've been inspired by the work of Georgia O'Keeffe, and we're learning from her powerful words: "I've been absolutely terrified every moment of my life – and I've never let it stop me from doing a single thing I wanted to do." We'll be keeping this in mind as we continue our exciting journey in Willow Class. Watch this space!

#### Sparx

What an amazing start to your SPARX home learning, well done everyone and thank you for all your hard work and effort.



Your child will have brought home a letter or log-in card containing a link to the SPARX website and their unique username and password. Please support your child to regularly complete their SPARX home learning independently, so they are confident with their multiplication facts, for their current and future

learning. SPARX home learning will be set every Friday; all children on SPARX need to get to 100% by the following Friday. Please support children to answer questions independently, so the subsequent questions remain relevant to their learning; if overly supported the questions may become too difficult.

The expectation for Year 3- Year 6 is to get 3 tokens, which means answering 30 questions correctly each day, over at least 3 days. Recalling facts more often will increase your child's learning by building and strengthening brain connections. Knowing multiplication facts will support their future maths learning and free up space in the working memory, allowing them to tackle and enjoy more complex problems and increase their confidence. Thank you in advance for supporting your child to complete their weekly SPARX home learning. If you have any questions or we can help in any way, please contact your class teacher.

#### The correlation between glue ear and language development

Glue ear happens when sticky fluid blocks part of your child's ear. This makes sounds seem muffled, like having fingers in your ears. Your child might find it harder to hear you or friends, especially when it's noisy. Listening can take lots of effort, so they may get tired, distracted, or struggle to hear words clearly. This can sometimes affect their talking and understanding.

Glue ear is very common – about 8 in 10 children in the UK will get it at some point. It often happens after a cold and usually clears up on its own within a few months.

#### How you can help

- Turn down background noise like the TV or music.
- Get face-to-face with your child so they can see your expressions.
- Say their name or gently touch them to get their attention before talking.
- Speak slowly and break instructions into small steps. Repeat if needed and give them extra time to respond.
- If your child says something incorrectly, repeat it back the right way as a model. For
  example, if they say "I see | j| ' tat," you can say, "Yes, you see a little cat!"
- Tell your child's nursery or school so they can support them too.

Most children catch up once glue ear clears, but if it lasts a long time it can affect speech and learning new words.

#### If you're worried:

- Talk to your child's nursery, school, GP, or audiologist.
- Try the Progress Checker on speechandlanguage.org.uk.
- In some cases, children may need hearing aids or grommets if glue ear doesn't go away.

# Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
