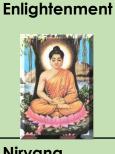

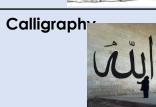

11. Mandala- Overview

- The mandala helps facilitate meditation. The creation of mandalas requires intense focus, stillness, and attention to the present moment –key components of mindfulness meditation. Mandalas always begin from the epicentre (middle), and grow outwardly.
