## Respecting Rights - Citizenship

**KS1 | Planning Overview** 

### **About the Topic**

This unit is based on the concept that we should all be rights-respecting citizens in our communities. It is inspired by the fact that all people have rights that are shared and that it is important for us all to respect these rights. It aims to enable the children to explore the concepts of difference and fairness and encourages them to reflect on how we should behave towards those who are different from us and why it is important to be fair. In this unit, children also learn about who helps us to protect our rights and what we can do if we don't feel safe. They will also reflect on how they can take part in the school community and why it is good to do what we can to make a positive difference.



### **Home Learning**

**Showing Respect for Differences:** In this activity, the children will draw a picture of someone who is different from them and write ways in which they can show respect to that person. They will also reflect on why it is important to show respect to people who are different from them.

Making a Difference: In this activity, the children consider how they can make a positive difference in their family and local community. They will draw pictures of things they would like to commit to doing and write an accompanying sentence for each one.



### Wider Learning:

Plan and hold a 'Celebration of Difference Day' – invite members of the school and local communities to both attend and contribute.

### **Assessment Statements**
