## Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>Occupation</b>	A job or type of work somebody does
<b>Support</b>	To make it easier for someone to do something
<b>Provide</b>	To give somebody something
<b>Disaster</b>	a sudden event causing much damage or suffering
<b>Distress</b>	Causes extreme worry and stress
<b>Courage</b>	Not showing fear when something is scary or dangerous
<b>Assistance</b>	To provide help/support
<b>Protect</b>	To defend or keep safe
<b>Emergency</b>	A sudden serious or dangerous event which needs immediate action to deal with it
<b>Rescue</b>	To save someone from a dangerous thing
<b>Hero</b>	Someone who has a lot of courage and does things to help others
