This Week in school

Dear Parents and carers,

Another busy week at Wynstream as clubs and activities began this week.

Not only do we have daily free sports clubs for children, but we also have clubs such as choir, art club, sewing club and library club. This week some of our Year 6 pupils volunteered to start clubs for younger children so we now have a KS1 choir, chess club, sketching club, quiet colouring club and writing club. There may be more starting soon as other children have expressed an interest in starting clubs.

We also have a daily Breakfast club and after school club to provide wrap-around care, there is a charge for both of these.

On Monday we held a PANTS assembly where we shared how important it is to be safe in and out of school and how this links to our rules, British Values and the UN Rights of a Child.

As a UN Rights Respecting School, we recognise that children should be protected from any activities that could harm their development and wellbeing (Article 36).

Consultation on Proposal to Change Age Range from 4-11 to 3-11 Years (Effective September 2026)

We are writing to inform you that Wynstream Primary School is proposing to change its age range from **4-11 years** to **3-11 years**, by introducing a nursery/pre-school provision for children aged 3+. This change is considered a **significant alteration** under Department for Education (DfE) guidance and requires formal consultation.

Consultation Details

The consultation will run for **four weeks**, starting:

- **Start Date:** Tuesday **13 January 2026**
- **End Date:** Tuesday **10 February 2026**
