What SEND means



SEND means some children need extra help with learning, communication, moving, or feeling safe and calm.

Different types of needs



Children may need help with:

- Talking and understanding words
- Learning new things
- Autism (finding changes or loud noises hard)
- Feelings and friendships
- Hearing, seeing, or moving

How we notice children need help



Teachers, parents, and helpers watch how you learn. They look at:

- Your work in class
- Simple tests
- How you talk and play
- Reports from doctors or specialists

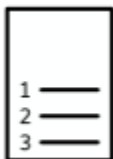
How we help you



You may get:

- Extra help in class
- Small group time
- 1:1 time with an adult
- Help from a speech therapist or other specialist

Learning Plans



Some children have a Learning Plan. This says what you are working on and what help you get. It is checked every term.

What is an EHCP?



Some children need lots of special help. An EHCP is a plan that makes sure a child gets everything they need.

How parents help



Parents meet teachers to talk about progress. Children can share their ideas too.

School activities



Children with SEND can join all trips, clubs, lessons, and fun events. Adults make changes so everyone can join in safely.

Feeling safe and happy



You can:

- Talk to a trusted adult
- Use a quiet space
- Have movement or sensory breaks
- Get help with worries or friendships

Who helps you



Lots of grown-ups help, like teachers, teaching assistants, the SENDCO (Mr Westley), and therapists.

If you are worried



You can talk to your teacher or another trusted adult. Adults will listen and help you.
