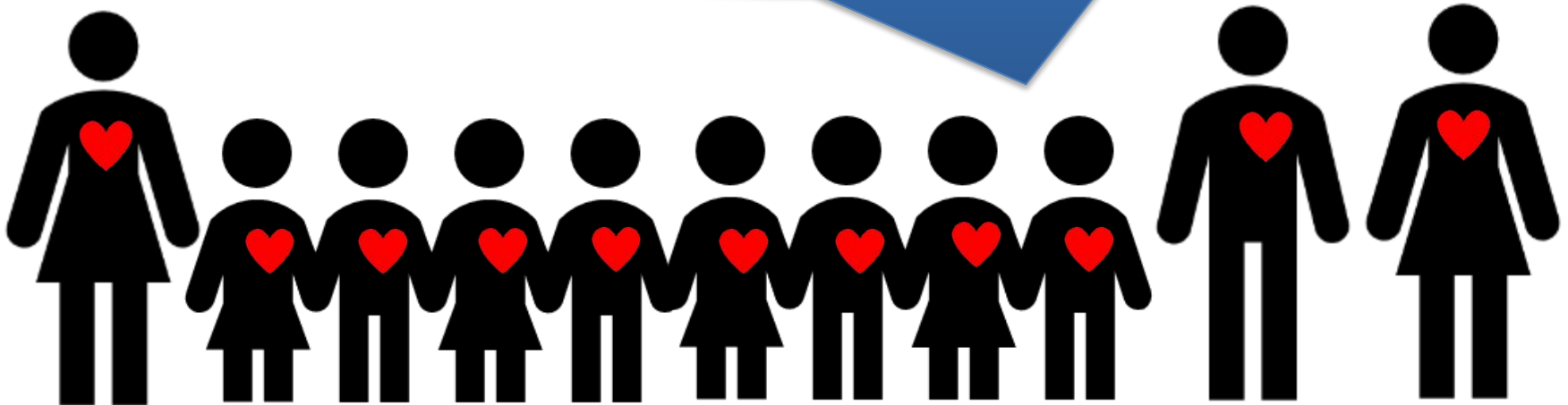

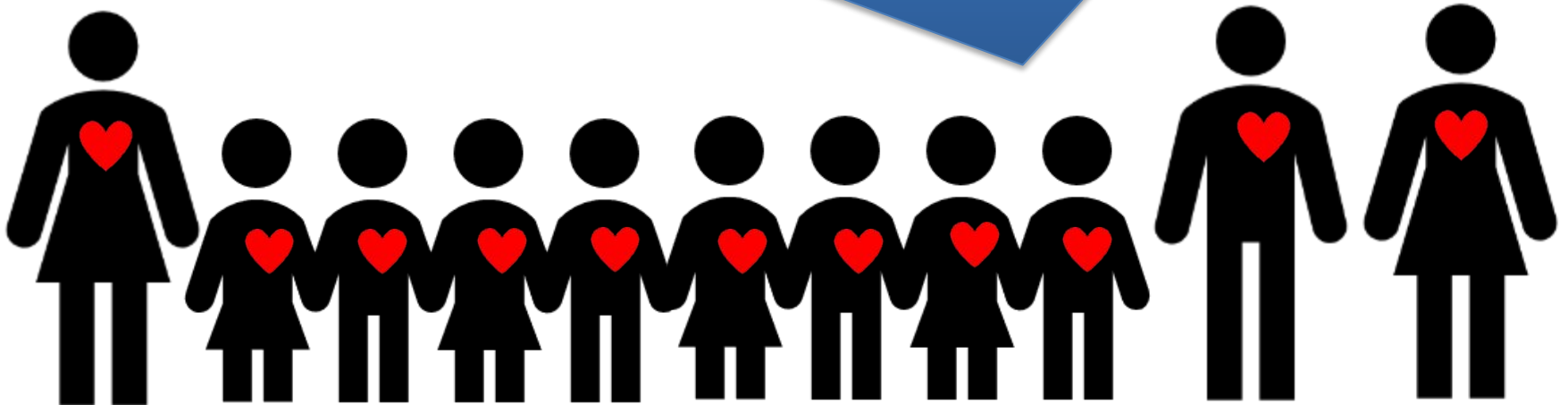

How would you feel if...

Someone called you names because of the place you were born?

Laughed at your clothes?

Told you that you didn't belong here?

Hurt you with their hands or feet because of the way you look or sound?

Ignored you when you asked for help?

How would you feel if you were a victim of racism?

Racism is treating people differently or unfairly because of their:

skin colour

religion

nationality

culture

Either alone, or a combination of these, are sometimes known as **ethnicity**

Sometimes, people treat others unfairly because of one of these parts of who they are. This might be on purpose or by accident. It usually happens because people think that they are better than other people.

Definition of Racism

Treating people differently or unfairly because of their:

Skin colour

Religion

Nationality

Culture
