Entry Requirements

How will I be studying?

This course will be taught in a class and you will be expected to make an active contribution in lessons. Lessons will be a mixture of listening, reading, speaking and writing, as well as grammar and translation work. You will also be required to work independently at home to learn vocabulary and practice exam skills.

How will I be assessed?

Exam Board: AQA

Students will be entered for either Higher Tier (Grades 9-4) or Foundation Tier (Grades 5-1)

There are four exams at the end of the course: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Each exam is worth 25% of your overall grade. You are entered for the same tier (Foundation or Higher) for all four papers.

The Speaking exam is conducted by your class teacher and takes place in April/May at a set date decided by the school.

Paper 1 - Listening

35 minutes (Foundation Tier) including 5 minutes reading time 45 minutes (Higher Tier) including 5 minutes reading time.

40 marks (Foundation Tier) / 50 marks (Higher Tier).

Paper 2 – Speaking

Role-Play + Photo Card + General Conversation on 2 themes 7–9 minutes (Foundation Tier) + 12 min preparation time 10–12 minutes (Higher Tier) + 12 min preparation time

60 marks (Foundation Tier and Higher Tier)

Paper 3 - Reading

45 minutes (Foundation Tier) 1 hour (Higher Tier) 60 marks (Foundation Tier and Higher Tier)

Paper 4 – Writing

- 1 hour (Foundation Tier)
- 1 hour 15 minutes (Higher Tier)

50 marks at Foundation Tier and 60 marks at Higher Tier
