What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)?

- The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.
- It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

Areas of Learning

In EYFS we cover 7 areas of learning which are:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Maths
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design




Characteristics of Effective Learning:

We also incorporate the characteristics of learning in our teaching and learning. 'Root Learning' is an important part of our curriculum that allows this to be achieved.

- Playing and exploring children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'
- Active learning children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties and enjoy achievements
- Creating and thinking critically - children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things

Phonics

- Phonics teaches children how to read by helping them link sounds (phonemes) to letters (graphemes).
- Children learn to blend sounds together to read words (e.g., c-a-t = cat) and segment words to help with spelling (e.g., dog = d-o-g).
- Learning phonics helps children become confident readers and writers.
- Reading regularly at home with your child really supports their phonics learning.





Reading

- We begin by reading in groups, sharing familiar stories and talking about them.
- In Term 2 we begin to give the children individual reading books to bring home and share with you.
- Books are matched to the phonics learnt in school and introduce a few letters/sounds at a time, allowing independent reading from the outset.
- We provide a log in for additional digital books on the 'Big Cat Collins' website.





Mathematics

In EYFS we cover:

- Composition of numbers to 10
- Subitising of numbers to 6
- Number bonds to 10
- Double facts up to 10
- Counting to 20
- Comparing quantities
- Representing patterns in numbers up to 10



The EYFS day

- Phonics lesson
- Guided reading
- Mathematics lesson and activities
- 'Root Learning' inside and outside
- Topic based learning sessions
- Story and singing times
- PE lessons (after term 1) weekly
- JIGSAW (PSHE lessons) weekly







Root Learning





Root learning is our core provision.

This takes place in both the inside and outside environments.

What does it promote?

- Learning through exploration
- Child-initiated learning
- Open-ended enquiry and investigation
- Promoting independence in making choices
- Becoming active learners so pupils develop the 'characteristics of effective learning' in the EYFS
- Supporting children's learning across the 7 areas of learning and development in the EYFS

P.E

- Your child will be taking part in P.E lessons during their time in EYFS.
- In Term 1 your child will not need a P.E kit as they will be just removing shoes and socks.
- In Term 2 your child needs to bring in a named P.E kit in a bag that can be left on their peg for the term.

How can you help prepare your child?

Coats (Ensure they can put it on unaided)

Toilet- independently if possible

Count (as much as possible)

Read lots of stories and poems

Use a knife and fork

Get dressed and undressed independently

Enjoy the summer on the beach/ in the woods/ garden, etc (enriching experiences)

- Please ensure that all of your child's uniform is clearly named.
- Your child will only need a school book bag.
- Water bottles must be brought in everyday and labelled with their name.
- Please ensure your child does not bring in any personal belongings.
- You can leave a spare set of clothes on your child's peg for emergencies.
