What a busy half term the Turtles have had! In English, as part of their novel study work, the children have been busy reading Roald Dahl's 'George's Marvellous Medicine,' where they have been using new vocabulary to write a diary entry, instructions and even a new chapter for the book! In celebration of



King Charles III's coronation, the children also used their instructional skills to make, and write about, their own marvellous coronation cocktails. In Science, as part of their Young Gardeners unit, the children have explored the school grounds, looking at the varying microhabitats in order

to survey and identify the different plants and animals that are growing in their local environment.

A highlight of our half term was, of course, celebrating the coronation of King Charles III. Along with the whole school, our class designed crowns and our chosen British artist was the punk icon, Vivienne Westwood. We also thoroughly enjoyed our "red, white and blue" day of celebration and particularly loved making our own coronation mocktails! Alongside all this excitement, we have loved our new novel study of "George's Marvellous Medicine" and have produced some super writing outcomes based on character descriptions, instructions and our own chapter. Peacocks


