

It is normal to have a span of ability in any class and teachers are expected to plan to meet their needs. I know there is still some anxiety but we will revisit this early next year to check in with you as parents.

We will start the new school year with Sarah Hodges in the role as SENDCO, she works in the Federation and has many years of experience. Over the past few weeks she has had an opportunity to meet with Mr Wynne and have some handover meetings. I know she will be welcomed warmly and plans to meet with parents of children with SEN early in the new year.
