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#### **Catch Up Funding 2020-21**

### **Wider Strategies**

- -Ensure pastoral contact home for disadvantaged families also identifying barriers to engagement due to technology or lack of other forms of support
- -Regular communication with families to build the strength of relationships already in place enabling families trust the school's approaches to grow and therefore support the strategies in place for learning & wellbeing
