At Oxley Primary School, we believe uniforms are important for many reasons:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- promotes a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes pupils feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable value for money by most parents and carers;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.



Uniform items with either the old or new logo may be worn during the transition.

What is our uniform?

School uniform	PE kits
• Plain white blouse/polo shirt with or without the school logo • Plain navy-blue sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without school logo) • Black/grey trousers, shorts or skirt • Navy blue and white gingham or plain navy dress, which can be worn with plain navy/black/grey leggings or tights (we do not allow leggings/ cycling shorts on their own) • Plain white/navy/grey/black socks • Fully black sensible school shoes • Trainers are acceptable if they are all black – no logos, e.g. <u>no white Nike ticks or Adidas stripes</u> Jewellery: only stud earrings and watches are allowed. Hair: plain white, navy or black hairbands/clips/ bows only Children should not wear any make-up, nail varnish or acrylic/false nails.	• A plain white round neck t-shirt, with or without school logo. No other logos are allowed. • Black/navy blue shorts • Black/navy blue jogging trousers • Black/navy jumper/zip-up hoodie • Spare trainers- for outdoor PE lessons • Plimsolls – for indoor lessons • Earring tape if your child has earrings. This micropore tape can be purchased from chemists or supermarkets. • Hair bobbles if your child has long hair Children should bring in their PE kits every Monday and keep them in school for the whole week. They will be sent home each Friday to be washed and checked. PE lessons form a vital part of our curriculum, and the children must take part in these lessons.



How will we encourage the children to look their best?

To encourage children, we will be giving out rewards for the correct uniform and PE kit. This means we can celebrate those children who take pride in their appearance.

What if a child is not wearing the correct uniform or PE kit?

There may be good reasons why a child is not wearing a school uniform. In these cases, reasons should be shared with the school as soon as possible, for example by talking to the teacher, ringing the

office or sending a message via Arbor. We will always be considerate and discreet when trying to establish why a child is not wearing the school uniform / PE kit. We do not want to make a child feel uncomfortable or discriminated against because of any particular family circumstance. Therefore, we encourage honest conversations.



How will the school respond?

The Headteacher and school staff expect all pupils to follow the school uniform policy and will discuss breaches of the school's rules on appearance or uniform with pupils and/or parents.

Pupils will be reminded of the uniform policy and asked to remove items or not to wear specific items the next day. If pupils do not comply with the school uniform policy, the following day, consequences may take place, such as:

- confiscation of banned item(s) for collection by parent / carer
- parents contacted and asked to bring in the appropriate clothing
- having to remove make-up or nail varnish using the remover supplied by the school
- having to wear a spare uniform supplied by the school for the day

Suppliers
