# Calverton Primary Pupil Premium Grant Plan 2019-20

#### Main barriers to Calverton disadvantaged children educational achievement.

- Only 27%% of the Calverton pupil population are classed as pupil premium.
- 31% of Pupil Premium children speak another language (41 languages spoken) Poor adult literacy is a problem, with parents unable to support their children at home, anecdotally 2 parents per class we believe are unable to read.
- Housing in the area is often of poor quality or cramped, evictions are common with landlords asking very high rents, homelessness/evictions are the most common issue when parents come to ask for Early Help support.
- Domestic violence is high, with 70% of children monitored for safeguarding concerns have a domestic violence incident in their history. On average 60% children who are monitored for safeguarding concerns are pupil premium.
- Mobility is high with an average of 41% of the pupil premium children new to Calverton in the last two years.
   The school takes in on average 2 children a week and on average one child a week leaves to attend another school.
- 20% of the disadvantaged children have a SEND need or EHCPlan.
- 36% of children below 90% attendance are disadvantaged.
