It has been another busy half-term for the Penguins! Our topic has been 'What is a pirate?'. We have enjoyed learning all about the fearsome pirate Blackbeard – we learnt about why he was so scary and we looked in atlases to find where he was born



and where he sailed to. We enjoyed our novel study book 'We're Going on a Treasure Hunt' and we did some amazing writing about the rabbit's journey in the story. We have been learning all about numbers up to 20 in Maths and thinking carefully about the value of each digit. In art, we used different types of paper to create sea-themed art and put them all together to create an ocean. Well done to the Penguins!

<u>Koalas</u>

Wow! What a fantastic half-term we have had. We have enjoyed learning all about pirates! In art, we explored watercolours and created a range of wonderful sea portraits using learnt techniques. In science, we have been busy exploring the spring season and also observing plants and trees around





our school grounds. In Geography, we have enjoyed learning about the United Kingdom and its surrounding oceans. We particularly enjoyed our map work about London!

Hedgehogs

Over this last half-term we visited Twycross Zoo as part of our new Geography unit, 'Why do penguins not need to fly?' Here we met zoo ranger Meg, who told us all about penguins before we

met them ourselves! We have also been busy finding out about habitats in Science, writing our own Esio Trot stories and learning how to play the handbells in music! Incredible work Hedgehogs!



<u>Owls</u>

What a half-term the Owls have had! To start our summer term, we enjoyed our trip to Twycross Zoo. Despite the day being slightly wet, nothing could dampen our spirits and the Owls were smiling all day. Following this, we performed our class



assembly for families and the whole school. Everyone was impressed with our learning across the curriculum including: setting descriptions, debates in history, showcasing wonderful impressionist artwork and a fantastic musical number using the handbells. In English, we have thoroughly enjoyed our work on Esio Trot where we had great fun designing our own balconies making sure we included a "riot of colour" just like Mr Hoppy. We also wrote as different characters and applied our reading skills to help us predict.

Leopards

What a fantastic first half to the summer term the Leopards have had! In English, the children are really enjoying reading the story 'How to Train Your Dragon,' where they have been learning how to



write using subordinate clauses, formal and informal language and even written and performed their own news flashes! The children are really enjoying the unit, 'Why are jungles so wet and deserts so dry?' and, following on from their school visit to the Botanical Gardens in Leicester, have combined their Geography work with Science and Computing to create their own animal classification keys using the Chromebooks. The lucky Leopards were also the first class to enjoy getting their paws

dirty with Mr Bill Burton who has resumed delivery of his polytunnel workshops again this year. Harvesting potatoes, planting parsley and dill and picking (and tasting!) the strawberries was simply grrr-eat!

Elephants

We've had another fantastic half-term in the Elephants with one of the highlights being our trip to Leicester Botanical Gardens - which we all really enjoyed. The class were fabulous and showed our Oxley values beautifully by engaging in the activities and asking thoughtful questions. The trip



complimented our work in science and geography where we've been learning about different habitats and plant adaptations both locally in Shepshed and further afar in places like the Amazon. We have really embraced the nature theme this term and have created our own natural art by collecting materials around the school to create paint and using sunlight to create our own cyanotype photos. As well as this, we were lucky enough to have a visit from the River and Canals Trust where we learnt about the importance of managing rivers to keep our homes safe. All of this alongside some brilliant decimal, fraction and measures work in maths and a wealth of writing linked to our book: How to Train Your Dragon in English. Great work Elephants!

<u>Tigers</u>

Wow, what an amazing half-term the Tigers have had! We had an amazing time on our trip to the Botanical Gardens in Leicester and thoroughly enjoyed learning about different habitats and plant adaptations. Our bus driver was superb as well and played some excellent tunes on the journey to distract us from the traffic jam! This trip tied in so well with our Geography work on deserts and rainforests as well as our science work on habitats. We built on this work within art too by creating incredible cyanotype printing using different natural materials from our school grounds. Within music, we have really enjoyed creating our own pieces using Garageband and have been loving experimenting with the different audio effects we could create. All of the class have been showing our 'being kind' school value by listening to others' work and giving such positive feedback. Super work Tigers!

<u>Lemurs</u>

What a jam-packed, exciting half-term! We started our new book called Holes. We are really enjoying the novel so far and have particularly enjoyed putting



ourselves in someone else's shoes and writing in character. We also had a very exciting science unit, looking into the circulatory system, we explored the function of the circulatory system, made our own blood and even dissected a real heart! This half-term we also had our school trip, where we visited the Leicester Central Mosque. We learned about their way of life and were mesmerised by the detail and decoration inside. We also explored the Leicester Museum and Art Gallery, where we particularly enjoyed the exhibits on dinosaurs and the Ancient Egyptians. Additionally, we had an incredibly busy day baking. We made: hot cross buns, cookies, Victoria sponge cakes and brownies. They smelt delicious! Finally, we were very lucky to have the sun shining for our Beskilled sports event. We were sent on a mission to use science to find out who stole the Chromebooks. We used chromatography, tested pH scales, identified fingerprints and looked at the evidence through microscopes to conclude before enjoying an afternoon of sports.



Foxes and Lions

Well, what a term! Our Year 6 have been working extremely hard looking at the circulatory system in science which finished with dissecting pig hearts on Wednesday. The children loved this experience and were able to show their growing knowledge of scientific vocabulary by identifying features such as atria, ventricles and aortic valves. This half-term we have also combined art, design and history by learning about the Maya civilisation and using this knowledge to understand how people dressed according to their status. We have begun to complete our designs linked to jewellery and head attire and will venture into making this next term. With six weeks to go, we will turn our focus to making sure the children are ready to transition to High School and embark on the next step of their educational journey.

Naturally, we have spent much of the beginning of the term consolidating our knowledge in the areas that we knew we would be tested on during SATs Week. Mr Burton, Miss Milner and Mrs Woolcock would like to say how proud we are of our amazing children for having the Oxley 'I can' attitude and being so supportive of one another throughout. With only six weeks to go after the half term, we have a lot to 'pack in' including spending our enterprise money on celebratory treats, finishing our writing modules and focusing on transitioning to high school.
