





positive effect on academic attainment



School attendance has a positive effect on academic attainment ¹¹ ² ³. Students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results ¹. Pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well ¹. Missing out on important parts of the curriculum due to lower attendance may result in poorer performance in school exams, increased risk of dropout, and a lower likelihood of progressing to higher education ². The higher the absence rate, the lower the likely level of attainment ³.

Phonics - Reading and Spelling







Phonics Screening Check

- National test for Year 1 pupils
- Assesses children's phonics decoding skills
- A one-to-one reading with their teacher
- Reading 40 words, split into two sections
- A mix of 20 real words and 20 pseudo-words (nonsense words)
- Pseudo-words are accompanied by a picture of an imaginary creature to show they are not real word





What you can do to help your child



Artificial Intelligence (AI) Policy

- Staff will begin to use AI to enhance teaching, reduce workload, and support personalised learning. All Al outputs must be fact-checked, sensechecked, and remain the professional responsibility of the staff member. Decisions are human based NOT Al.
- The school is only using approved Al tools: this includes so far Copilot, Chat GPT, Key GPT, Canva, Google translate, Google Gemini, Teach Mate
- No personal, sensitive, or identifiable data will be entered into AI tools
- Al must not be used to generate offensive, discriminatory, or harmful content, nor to impersonate others.

Al Policy

- Safeguarding is a priority: any Al-related concerns must be reported immediately.
- Staff will guide pupils to understand both the benefits and risks of AI, encouraging critical thinking.
- Pupils will use Al only under supervision for learning support or research at school. It can be used at home for research, but not for completing home learning please.
