# The Oaks Nursery Car Park

Can we please remind you of the arrangements for using the Oaks car park, to ensure the safety and smooth running of drop-offs and pick-ups:

#### **Drop-Off and Pick-Up Times**

- Parents/carers may use the Oaks car park for a short period at the start and end of the school day, provided there is a parking bay available.
- There is a 20-minute grace period in the car park. This gives you time to drop off or collect your child without needing to purchase a Pay & Display (P&D) ticket.

A member of the University Security Team is usually present during these busy times to support and assist where needed.


#### Using the Car Park at Other Times
