	Provision of CPD / Training to teaching staff; all teaching staff received a block of training, tailored to their own development needs – based on a strengths and development area survey. Assessment evidence will show an improvement in teachers' skills and confidence and pupil outcomes. Dance and tag rugby sessions taken and CPD provided at the same time, for 3 classes.	£1600	Dance lessons were undertaken by the Year 3/4 classes this year and notes taken by staff specifically around the structure of the lessons as well as observations of how to deliver the sessions.  Children were well engaged in the sessions and performed their routines to their peers.  Observations took place of staff, to up level skills and to feel more confident with the subject.  Leicester Tigers outreach coaches also came into school and delivered a sessions to the Year 5 and 6 children, teachers were able to watch and develop an understanding how to better teach tag rugby sessions and upskill themselves.

The year 5 and 6 had the pool to themselves in their own year groups, the Year 4s then went back with the Y6 pupils that needed booster lessons to aid with the 25m statutory measure. Ability was measured in week one and children were then split into ability or confidence groups and reshuffled as the weeks progressed to ensure pupils teaching was appropriate to their swimming needs.

Subsidising the transport was a necessity as there isn't a pool locally that would have been able to cater for the numbers, needs and the ability spread of the school.
Purchase Get Set 4 PE to support non- specialists in planning PE skills and progression across the school <b>Key indicators: 1, 2, 3</b>	Lesson plans have progressive activities that are designed to inspire and engage pupils, allowing them to explore and develop skills and embed knowledge.	£550	The scheme continues to be used by all staff and successful in its implementation. All teachers and coaching staff followed the planning as well as the curriculum map to make sure the coverage of the skills and sports were there. Pupils this year followed cycle A of our two-year rolling curriculum programme. The two-year rolling programme ensure pupils are developing their skills across the phases and have the opportunity to participate in a range of sports and activities.
After school club provision to provide pupils with additional opportunities to take part in active sport  Key indicators:2, 4, 5	Sessions are led by a skilled practitioner to provide pupils with various opportunities to further develop skills and knowledge linked to the National Curriculum as well as taking part in additional physical exercise	£1000	Football, basketball, tennis and multisport clubs were on offer from specialist sports coaches and all were fully booked; which were free to pupils to attend. The children in KS2 were then able to be selected for local fixtures (linked to the Charnwood Sports Partnership).
Silver membership with Charnwood Sport and transport to local competitions Key indicators: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5	Enable opportunities for competitions with other primary schools within Charnwood as well as increased participation and scope across a range of sporting activities.	£1500	We took part in over 15 different sporting events last year, ranging from inclusive sports such as boccia, through to tennis, tag rugby, football and cricket. These was open to children from Year 3-6 and were popular in terms of pupils signing up and attending the local competitions.
Specialist coaches leading sport at lunchtimes  Key indicators:1, 2, 3, 4	Sessions are led by a skilled practitioner to provide pupils with various opportunities to further develop skills and knowledge linked to the National Curriculum as well as taking part in additional physical exercise	£4212	PE coaches are deployed at lunchtimes and run sports on the ball court and the field. Lunchtime sport provision varied in terms of the activities on offer and the age of pupils engaging in the sessions. The specialist sports coaches enable lunchtimes to become more skill focussed and competitive sports were appropriately supervised and refereed.

Weekly release time for PE lead.  Key indicators: 2, 3, 4, 5	Release time for PE to monitor and evaluate PE provision across the school. Time is also ring-fenced for arranging local completions with other primary schools	£1100	Weekly release time for the PE lead enabled sporting fixtures to be arranged in terms of releasing bookings for parents, transport and risk assessments. Release time also enabled the PE lead to order kit and ensure PE provision was resourced effectively.
Purchase additional equipment to support physical & mental wellbeing.  Key indicators: 2, 4	Equipment and resources purchased to support the PE curriculum and provide a range of opportunities to support pupils' physical and mental well-being. Updating old kit that may not be fit for purpose and allowing access to different sporting fixtures, eg Rice Bowl.	£1100	There was a continued investment in the equipment this year with a new Oxley sports kit, netball bibs, beanbags, javelins, sipping ropes and sports day equipment to name a few. All equipment purchased has had a positive impact on the provision and enabled pupils to further develop their skills and participation in sports across the entire school.
Subsidise transport to competitive events.  Key indicators: 1, 4, 5	Travel to events organised by North Charnwood as well as other fixtures or sporting opportunities in the local area, as well as Tennis in Nottingham.	£2100	This budget was used to fund transport to events that took place throughout the academic year. All children from EYFS to Year 6 attended separate competitive sports days that were organised for each year group with our local partnership of schools. Our Year 5 and children also attended the Rothesay Open in Nottingham to take part in expert led tennis workshops in the morning; they then got the opportunity to watch professional tennis players in the afternoon. Having a lack of green space on the school grounds highlights the need to travel to venues that allow children to have secure and dedicated spaces that give them the opportunity to take part in various competitive sports and physical activities.
Celebration of success and confidence boost.  Key indicators: 1, 4, 5	Ordering small things such as medals and trophies etc for sports day, as well as other token gestures to increase participation numbers.	£175	This was a successful initiative and one enabled the school to celebrate a weekly "Sportsperson of the week" in our Friday Star of the Week assembly. This supported a sense of belonging and representing the school while embracing values of showing good sportpersonship - which were always linked back to our core school values.
