Toys

We have seen an influx in pupils arriving to school with toys brought in from home. Please can you make sure your children leave their personal items at home as we have had some upset children who have lost, given away or damaged their toys and it has caused unnecessary sadness. We cannot be held responsible for the loss of these items. In special circumstances, some pupils have an agreement with our school Inclusion Lead in place. This allows those pupils to bring a

personal belonging with them as a strategy to help them through the day. Thank you for your understanding.

Reviewing our security measures

You might be aware that a new law came into force called Martin's Law that has been created to improve public safety as well as protecting staff and pupils. We are currently reviewing our procedures and would like to remind parents/carers that the school gates are closed at 9am and at 3.40pm each day. Please make sure you have left the grounds by these times. If you need to speak to a member of staff that might go beyond these times, please contact the school office so we know who is on our school grounds (we do have pupils and staff on site until 6pm). In the interest of safety, we ask all parents not to walk through the school building whilst the pupils are in school. All adults have to wear security lanyards during the school day and be signed in.

Our Poet in Residence Visits Year 5

Over the past few months, we have been building a link with local poet, Tom Delahunt – the author of 'The Wandering Lamb' which he shared with us last year. His passion for all things creative has enabled us as a school to think about how we can use his skills and enthusiasm with the children. Tom has now become our 'poet in residence' and will be working with us to develop the creative skills which we feel are so important to instil in our children throughout their time at Blean.

Earlier this week, Tom spent the day in Year 5 with Packham Class to introduce his next book: 'The Butterfly Farmer'. The day was all about spontaneous creativity based on a simple walk around our outside space where the children were encouraged to gather any objects which would inspire a piece of poetry or art. I was lucky enough to spend the day with the children and was totally blown away by the way they were completely hooked on the day's activities and embraced every minute to be creative.

The children used words like 'confidence', 'transformed', 'chilled', 'calm' and 'inspirational' to describe their day. Tom summed up the day with: "Wow... Just wow...Nothing else to say..." We are already looking forward to his next visit in the Spring where we will be developing a butterfly garden outside alongside our very own butterfly farms. This will be another amazing opportunity for the children to get creative.

Year 6 Forensic Science Workshop

As part of the History learning in Year 6 this term, the children have been studying Crime and Punishment through the ages. This morning, Year 6 enjoyed a visit from Robert Green OBE, who is Professor of Forensic Science at The University of Kent.

The children were given a lesson about fingerprints: how they are formed, the different types and patterns, where to find them and how they can be used to identify individuals.

Everyone then had the opportunity to fill out a police fingerprint form with their own prints, which in real life would be used to put them on to a data base. All children also made a fingerprint for their very own souvenir key ring! Who knows, in years to come, some of our students may become forensic scientists themselves...
