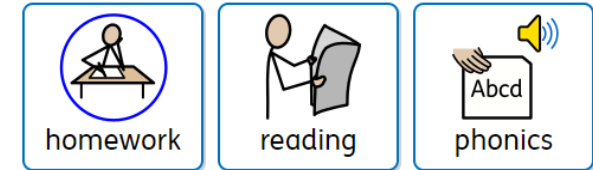

Curriculum Subject Learning

WHAT DO WE NEED TO KNOW? HOW CAN WE LEARN THIS? WHO CAN WE LEARN FROM?

PSHE: Relationships – Families, making and keeping friends, being the best that they can be

Physical Development: Dance - focusing on different moves / sequencing and balancing

Literacy: We will be reading 'Three Little Pigs', 'Oliver's Vegetables', 'Oliver's Milkshake' and some information books about farms and lifecycles. We will be retelling the stories and making our own versions; doing some descriptive writing about the characters; reading and following instructions; creating posters and writing sentences.

Maths: Ordering numbers to 10/20, talking about bigger or smaller numbers and where they appear on the number line, counting out amounts to 10/20, making numbers in different ways to 10, to recall doubles, consolidating the names and properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes.

Understanding the World: Animals and their babies, comparing and contrasting farms in different countries/at different times in history, discussing what products come from a farm, testing which objects move when blown

Expressive Arts and Design: Exploring different textures, choosing materials to make houses and animals, singing songs about farms, making up farm rhythms
