Our topic this term has been 'What is it like to be me?' and the children have enjoyed the stories of The Gingerbread Man and the Gingerbread Girl. We have practised labelling parts of our bodies, practised using our 5 senses and created self portraits. We have also been learning about Harvest and put on two amazing performances of our harvest assembly! A great start to the year Penguins – well done!



<u>Koalas</u>

Wow! What a fantastic start to the year we have had in the Koalas class! The children have settled in well to their new class with all their new friends! We have had great fun this term learning all about the Gingerbread Man and creating our own alternative endings to the story. In our topic "What is it like to be me?" we have been busy making self portraits and



exploring our senses in our science learning. To top it off we learnt all about Harvest and loved performing our class assembly to the whole school as well as our parents and carers!

Hedgehogs

What a wonderful half term we have had in the Happy Hedgehogs class! The children have been very busy expanding their place value and addition and subtraction knowledge in Maths. The Hedgehogs have also been working hard on retelling a story as a part of our Novel study book – After the fall. We created our own Humpty Dumpty characters using eggs (hard boiled of course) and we used these to retell the story. We enjoyed creating our own noun towns and writing a diary entry as Humpty Dumpty. We have also had lots of fun in Art creating wax resist pictures and using natural materials to explore pattern and composition. Well done Happy Hedgehogs! Keep up the super work.



<u>Owls</u>

The Owls have kicked off the new school year with a bang! All of the children have settled in and have enjoyed engaging with all of their learning. In English, we have read the story of "After the Fall" which was all about the story of how Humpty Dumpty regains his courage. We had great fun making our own eggs to act out the story, wrote diaries, created setting descriptions and this culminated in a super retell. Our topic in History this term has been the swinging 60s and we have



learned about how historians use timelines to divide up time. We made our own and also looked at key historical events from the decade. The Owls have also loved their science unit this term where we have been classifying and looking at features of different animals. A firm favourite was looking at a real fish to examine real life gills, scales and fins!

Leopards

We have had an excellent first half term in the Leopards! We have been reading the book 'Into the Forest,' and thinking about how the author uses colour to create moods and feelings. This was echoed in our Art lessons, where we have been looking at Laura Caplin and Shaun Tan and

copied their styles to illustrate our own versions of Lewis Carroll's Jabberwocky poem. In our History lessons we have been studying the Romans and seeing what made them a force to be reckoned with, as well as some of the amazing inventions that they created which we still use today.





Elephants

The Elephants have had an amazing start to year 3/4 and have settled in brilliantly! This half term we have been deepening our understanding of place value in Maths, continuing to read and enjoy a variety of texts in Reading and develop our writing ideas with our novel study book 'Into the Forest'. As we came to the end of our novel study, the children enjoyed our picnic afternoon eating 'lovely fruit cake' and drinking the 'milky-moo cow' milkshakes. During this half term the Elephants have focussed on researching all about the Romans in our History lessons and many have found links to other historical events as well. In Art, the children have thoroughly enjoyed studying artists, such as: Laura Carlin and Shaun Tan



producing similar works of art in concertina books or Manga style. Within our music lessons, the year 3s have been learning how to play a recorder while the year 4s have been taught by a specialist teacher to play a ukulele - exciting!

Tigers

Wow! What a busy half term we have had! The Tiger's kicked off our first English unit by discovering lots of unusual items in the KS2 area. They loved predicting what our story could be about and who the items may have belonged to. This then led to some amazing writing based on 'Into the Forest.' We have

been blown away at the authors in training we have! We have also thoroughly enjoyed our ukulele lessons on a Friday with Mr Stevens. Mr Stevens is teaching us the 4 main notes G, C, E, A by using the rhyme 'Good





Cows Eat Apples!' The Tigers have been even more creative in art this term by illustrating their own zig zag books of the Jabberwocky. We are very lucky to have such creative Tiger cubs in our pack!

<u>Lemurs</u>

Wow! What a jam-packed start we've had in the Lemurs. We have been hands-on in science looking for organisms and creating classification keys for our findings. We became archaeologists in history, exploring and determining Shang artefacts and their uses as well as deciphering hieroglyphs. We have also done plenty of acting in English to understand

characters' feelings and develop setting descriptions. Finally, we are well on the way to becoming professional DJ's and are thoroughly enjoying learning different scratches in Turntablism. instruments!



Lions and Wolves

Well, what a start Year 6 have had! Lessons are in full swing and we have been concentrating on all things grammar in English – making sure we use the correct terminology and using this within our writing. Our first novel study has been 'The viewer' by Gary Crew which the children have particularly loved and as we speak, we have just moved onto 'Cloud Busting' by the fabulous Malorie Blackman. In maths, we have been consolidating and stretching our place value knowledge and beginning to work on specific arithmetic skills involving the four calculations. In science, we are looking at organisms and





micro-organisms and the children have loved being outside as much as possible. In history, the children have been looking at the Shang Dynasty and using their historian skills to compare with the ancient Egyptians. If this wasn't enough, we have been really creative by learning not only turntablism in music alongside harmonies and pitch in our double music lessons but have been looking at various artists such as Lubaina Himid, George Cruikshank and Pablo Picasso in art ready to turn our skills into a 3D art extravaganza! The children have earnt their half term break that's for sure!
