



English:

The texts we are reading and discussing this term, that will be supporting our writing outcomes, are 'The Way Home for Wolf' by Rachel Bright and Jim Field and 'The Story Machine' by Tom McLaughlin.

Science:

We will be studying habitats in science this term and taking a closer look at how plants and animals adapt and survive in their habitat.

Maths:

Year 1:

Children will learn to:

Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number. Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens. Given a number, identify one more and one less. Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20. Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as $7 = \square - 9$, Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.

Year 2:

Children will learn to:

Identify and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. Identify 2D shapes on the surface of 3D shapes. Compare and sort 2D and 3D shapes. Recognise and find a fraction of a shape. Draw bar models to represent fractions. Find a fraction of a quantity. Derive and use related facts.

Art (links to computing):

We will be studying Digital Art this term, looking at the work of various artists and learning to create the effects using technology.
