School Uniform Policy

The school uniform is an important part of our school vision in developing a sense of belonging and children being proud of their appearance and their school. The uniform also represents the school and its standards when in school and when representing the school on trips or off-site sporting activities. Used school uniform in good condition is available from the office, the school also supports parents to acquire uniform when required.

The uniform is as follows:

Burgundy sweatshirt/cardigan with logo (available from school or Baby Planet, Market Street, Ashby de La Zouch).

Red and white checked summer dress or grey or black pinafore dress or skirt of an appropriate length.
Black or grey tights or socks.

White blouse or polo shirt with logo (available from school, or Baby Planet) It is desirable that children have polo shirts with logos but not essential.

Grey or black trousers. Grey or black shorts of an appropriate length.

Plain black shoes (not trainers). If a child has lost or grown out of their shoes on a temporary basis and comes into school in trainers, the school may lend the child black pumps to wear in school in the short term.

Reversible Burgundy coats / fleeces with logos will be available, which children can wear for school. These are to be worn over jumpers or cardigans and are not a replacement for jumpers or cardigans. Please ensure that all children have a coat with a hood in school at all times.

Physical Education

Children need a change of clothes for Physical Education and out of school hours sport and physical activity, if they are taking part or not. Only in exceptional circumstances will children not be expected to change. This should be kept in school at all times in a named bag. In KS1 and particularly in Reception, children may not always change if they are taking part in daily Physical Activity or Physical Literacy. Children will always be expected to change back into uniform after afterschool clubs have ended. Children must wear boots and shin pads when representing the school in football or tag rugby or taking part in an afterschool club. We may be able to lend these to children if they are available.

The Physical Education uniform is as follows:

Yellow or Burgundy t-shirt with logo (available from school, or Baby Planet)

Plain black shorts (No logos or stripes).

Plain dark blue or black jogging bottoms and sweat shirt may be worn in colder weather for outdoor PE.

A burgundy hoody with logo, available from school can be worn for PE but not for school.

A change of socks (preferably white)

Trainers with laces or Velcro fasteners. (Not pumps or plimsolls).

Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back with a hair bobble or clips.

Jewellery

For reasons of health & safety, children must not wear necklaces, brooches, rings or bracelets to school. Children may wear watches, but must be responsible for them. Children with pierced ears may wear plain stud earrings only, but these must be removed for Physical Education. This is the children's responsibility and staff will not be able to assist with the removal and replacement of earrings. If a child is unable to remove their earrings as they are new, it will not exclude them from Physical Education, however their participation may be limited depending on the activity.

Hair Cuts

We would be very grateful if parents would ensure that children's haircuts reflect the standards of the school and are not a distraction to themselves or others. Please try to avoid extreme haircuts. If you are unsure please ask before cutting to avoid any confusion.

Make up and Nail Varnish

Make up or nail varnish must not be worn at school. This includes temporary tattoos, which need to be washed off before returning to school. It is however acknowledged that temporary tattoos may be put on at a school disco or school event and therefore may be worn the following day, but please remove within a couple of days.

Caps Hats and Sunglasses

In the summer, children can wear plain caps and or sunglasses as protection from the sun. These must be removed when indoors and remain the responsibility of the child. In the winter hats and gloves can be worn but must be removed when in school.
