Nursery News

The Nursery children have had a busy start to the Autumn 2 term. We started our topic "Into the Woods" with a favourite story - The Gruffalo. The children enjoyed exploring musical instruments and moving like the animals from the story. They then learned about the Hindu festival of Diwali and made sparkling diva lamps from salt dough, paint and glittery jewels. We learned about why people wear poppies and made our own poppies for Remembrance Day. Last week we had great fun exploring the 'Great Outdoors' on our 'Welly Walk', looking at and listening to the signs of Autumn. We also enjoyed the story Where the Wild Things Are and created movements to dance like 'Wild Things' to the music In the Hall of the Mountain King by the composer Grieg.

Another busy start to the term! So far we have been doing some wonderful work with our key texts, 'Stuck' by Oliver Jeffers and 'Aliens Love Underpants' by Claire Freedman and Ben Cort. We have thought about how to be resilient and not give up when things are tricky. Our writing has also got much better and we are continuing to use 'Fred Fingers' when spelling. The children had a lot of fun designing their own underpants. In maths, we have been looking very closely at numbers 4 and 5, learning about different ways they can be represented. We have also started to use a part-whole mat to begin to investigate addition.








Year 1 Remembrance Day Poppies







Year 2 News












Year 2 have gotten stuck into their new topic for this term: The Poles. They have learned about where the North and South Poles are and how the climate there is different to the climate in the UK. They have also learned about the Inuit, a group of people who have adapted how they live to life in the Arctic. The children have enjoyed learning about what the Inuit people eat, what their houses and transportation are like, and what they wear to keep warm. They have read the book A Promise is a Promise and are beginning to write warning tales featuring Inuit children who live in the Arctic.

Autumn 2 is off to a great start! The Year 3 children have learnt about different artists, such as Van Gogh and Monet, and the techniques they used to create some of their most famous works.

Year 3 have also been learning about prehistoric Britain, from The Stone Age to The Iron Age, and have been writing nonchronological reports to share their new knowledge and their favourite facts.





The children have made great progress in maths, working on applying their adding and subtracting to word problems as well as progressing with core skills like times tables.

We are currently reading Philip Pullman's *The Firework Maker's* Daughter in guided reading and have thoroughly enjoyed reading it and the work it has inspired so far.
