Learning Together to Enjoy and Achieve

**English:** We will continue to find answers to our question: 'How are families affected by War?' through reading picture books relating to World War II and writing reports, letters and poems. We will celebrate our learning through creating an anthology of poems. We will continue to read 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo.

**Maths:** In Maths, we will be learning about ratio - how to use the associated language and the symbol. We will also introduce simple algebraic equations. Alongside this, we will be looking at co-ordinates and using these to describe translations and reflections in a grid.

**Science:** This term we will be studying Light. We will look at how light appears to travel, how we see things and testing materials for reflectiveness.

#### Music:

This term we will be analysing and performing a collection of songs and music from World War Two and begin to learn some basic keyboard skills.

#### PSHE:

Our PSHE focus this term is 'Dreams and Goals'. We will initially look at personal goals before looking more at collaborative goals.

#### Design Technology:

In DT, the children will have the opportunity to design and then make their own evacuee's teddy bear.

#### P.E. and Games:

We will learn basic volleyball skills in our indoor PE sessions. In our outdoor Games lessons, we will be practising large ball skills within netball, basketball and handball games.

#### PE days:

**Monday – PE**  
**Friday – Games**

#### RE:

We will be looking at a variety of beliefs about what happens after someone dies. We encourage you to discuss this topic at home as well.

#### Computing:

The children will explore variables in programming through games such as Scratch.

#### Spanish:

Year 6 will be exploring and describing different sports and considering their opinions on them. They'll also begin to use and identify parts of the verb 'jugar' (to play) as well as developing their Spanish speaking skills and incorporating conversation in more depth in their lessons.
