

Super Starter

Throughout the half term we will be visiting or have visitors in school talking to us about how they help in the community.

Curriculum Subject Learning

PSHE: We will be discussing 'keeping safe in the world around us' - raising children's awareness of potential dangers in their immediate surroundings, teaching them to be safe. In our Jigsaw topic we will focus on 'Dreams and Goals' getting children to think about their aspirations.

Physical Development: Showing good control and balance when riding bikes. Moving over an assault course pretending to be a fire fighter. How to keep healthy and safe. In PE the children will be focusing on Dance with control and coordination.

Literacy: Reading non-fiction texts about "People who help us." Writing fact files about 'People who help us'

Maths: Counting and matching amounts to numerals. Measuring the height and length of items. Weighing pets and comparing the weight. Measuring capacity of medicine bottles.

Understanding the World: Learning about people in our community and how they help us. Thinking about how we look after animals at home. Looking after ourselves and what happens when we are injured. Road safety. We will test different types of strings that would be best to make a bouncy cat toy along with classifying pets according to their characteristics in science. When we learn about the police we will be comparing finger / hand prints. We will look at changes over time of hospital and the fire service.

Expressive Arts and Design: Using our imagination within the role-play areas – fire station / hospital / veterinary surgery / garage. Learning songs / poems and rhymes about 'People who help us' Making collages of 'people who help us'


