
# Speak up!


## Year 4 Flutes


## Year 3/4 Linking Network

# Code Club





# Penguins



The Koalas class has had an exciting half-term! We began by exploring Diwali, creating Rangoli patterns and learning about various traditions. We also studied Bonfire Night and Autumn, discovering Guy Fawkes and engaging in poetry performances. In science, we examined seasonal changes and materials' properties. We delved into family history, creating family trees and welcoming visitors to share their stories. In D&T, we crafted Autumn textiles, enhancing our sewing skills. In Maths, they've mastered written methods for addition and subtraction and are confidently using expanded methods for multiplication. During Art, we explored patterns and created textured designs. In Geography, Science, and RE, we focused on caring for our world and sustainable living. What a wonderful term!

The Tigers shone at the flute concert, impressing parents and sharing their passion. Their curiosity about sustainability led to discussions on solar and wind power in geography. The term ended with the Tigers crafting Calligram poems about Christmas, showcasing their figurative language. In science, they explored electrical circuits, learning about conductors and insulators while lighting bulbs. Art lessons on colour and pattern were enjoyable, as they mixed primary colours and discovered tints and tones.

# Quokkas, Foxes and Lions



We've had a busy but exciting term in Year 5 and 6, full of creativity, learning, and fun! In Art, we've loved transforming our 2D designs into 3D creations, experimenting with different materials and techniques, and seeing our ideas come to life in new and exciting ways. English has been just as exciting as we've dived into *A Christmas Carol*. We started by writing detailed descriptions of Scrooge and the world he lives in, then stepped into his shoes to create diary entries from his perspective. It's been brilliant to explore his thoughts and feelings and really get into character. In French, we've been learning all about food and how to order it in a café. We've enjoyed practising conversations through role-play activities and building our confidence. PSHE has given us the chance to explore friendships and family. We've thought about what makes healthy friendships online and offline, how trust and loyalty play a part in our relationships, and why these things matter. Trying out some trust exercises has been a fun way to put our learning into action and strengthen our teamwork. Science has been particularly hands-on as we've explored electricity. We've built circuits, tested what happens when more components are added, and discovered some fascinating ways electricity works. It's been fantastic to see everyone's curiosity and problem-solving skills in action. We've also written and performed our own speeches on topics we are passionate about.
