WELCOME BACK

As we start the summer term, Calverton will see some changes – all for the better I believe! As the Executive Headteacher of CPD Schools Federation, I (Darren Williams) will head the leadership team for the school in the summer term. We will continue to use other Federation Leaders to drive the necessary changes to help achieve the aim of making Calverton one of the best schools in Newham to send your children to. I know many of you recognise things do need to get better. Staff, children, parents and governors will need to work hard together to achieve this. We want the Local Authority to confirm this is the case. They will be working closely with the school and leadership team to monitor our progress.

The staff had the INSET DAY first day back as an opportunity to plan a fresh start for Calverton. This included creating a new vision statement for the school - a few sentences that sum up what we want to do at Calverton; what the school wants to be known for and wants to achieve. We have discussed the main priorities of focus during the summer and these will be shared with you very soon.

Over the next couple of weeks there will be opportunities for you to share your views with the school and let us know about what concerns you most and share any ideas you have. OFSTED

Most of you will be aware of Ofsted—a Government Department for School Inspection. Calverton was last inspected in Summer 2017 and Ofsted aim to revisit schools every 5 years. That means we could expect a call any day from Ofsted to say they are coming in to inspect the school. This will be a Section 8 inspection. If the inspectors have real concerns about the school they will convert immediately to a Section 5 inspection. Whilst we are not expecting this, we do know that there needs to be a lot of improvements for the school to be judged securely as a 'good' school at the moment. During their visit they may think the same and say that they need to come back and look at the school again to make a judgement. Working together as a whole school community we can all help in our own way for the school to remain 'good'. We hope everyone will see improvements and be able to talk about these changes when Ofsted do visit the school.

RAMADAN AND EID—As the end of Ramadan approaches, a number of you will looking forward to the festival of Eid-Ul-Fitr. Most primary aged children are not expected to fast but understand how they may want to participate. Any children who are fasting (with parental permission) and remaining at school at lunch time will be provided with a quiet area to rest. May I take this opportunity to wish those celebrating Eid Mubarak in advance of next weekend.



PARENT DROP IN MEETINGS
