Dear Parents and Carers,
Please have a look over our class curriculum for the coming term. Our topic will be 'Are we too small to make a difference?'

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: This term we will be learning about how we can be 'responsible' by looking after our wonderful planet. In Jigsaw P.S.H.E, the children will be considering ways to keep their bodies healthy, such as regular exercise and staying hydrated.

Communication and Language: We will be continuing to work on our speaking and listening skills. We will work on speaking in small groups and to the class to share knowledge of how to look after the environment. The children will be motivated to write for a purpose, spreading our environmental messages, through the creation of posters and leaflets.

Literacy: EYFS will be inspired by an image during "Once Upon a Picture" to create some wonderful writing as we imagine who could live within the coastal scene and describe them. We will be reading the books 'Who swallowed Stanley', 'I'm not a cereal box' and 'Odd Fish'. We will also be writing sea animal facts, labelling posters and writing questions linked to our learning.

Mathematics: We will continue our daily 'Mastery Number' lessons where our focus will be on 'Composition of numbers to 10, doubling, wholes and parts and counting beyond 20'. In our other Maths lessons, we will be looking at subitising and comparisons and learning the number bonds to 10. We will also be learning some 3D shape names and properties.

Physical Development: This term we will be completing weekly PE lessons where we will focus on using small balls to throw, bounce and catch. We will also enjoy a dance lesson with Miss T, choreographing our own moves to "Under the Sea". This will include poses to represent the characters from the story of "The Little Mermaid", for example King Triton and Sebastian the crab.

Expressive Arts and Design:

This term we will be using playdough and junk modelling to create sculptures of sea animals. The work of "Washed Ashore" will inspire us to create a giant octopus in class too. We will use recycled resources to create musical instruments, exploring ways to make different sounds.

Understanding the World:

We will be learning about how we can help look after our planet. This will include learning about 'Recycle, Reuse and Reduce, taking part in a beach clean at our local beach.

The children will be engaged to learn facts about sea animals and ways in which they can be protected. We will learn about Sarah Roberts and her important work in this area.

In RE, we will identify some of the ways that Christian people celebrate Easter. This will involve looking at real resources and some of the associated symbols. We will also complete an Easter egg hunt around the school, alongside our buddies.
