Intent

It is our intent that our PSHE curriculum enables children to develop the skills and knowledge to face new situations, challenges and experiences with confidence, understanding and resilience.

Our curriculum is accessible and relevant to all children. It incorporates Relationships and Health Education and Sex Education and also links to British Values, Routes to Resilience, RE and collective worship. It is taught in a way that reflects the overall Christian ethos of the school and the seven key values whilst preparing them for the diversity of our modern world.



What?

We follow the Cambridgeshire PSHE Scheme which is a spiral, progressive scheme in which the children revisit topics and build on prior learning.

RSE

We teach the children about different types of families and relationships whilst promoting positive, healthy relationships. Elements of Sex Education are taught within the science curriculum and through the Cambridgeshire Scheme.

In addition to the Cambridgeshire Scheme, we have adopted the Everyone's Welcome approach to teaching about equality and diversity in line with British Values, Ofsted Guidance and the Equality Act 2010.
