- Visiting the park and the local Library.
- Encouraging independence e.g. helping with dressing, using a knife and fork and using face tissues.

Background Information on Topic

Our topic this term is 'Once upon a time' and we will be focussing on traditional stories such as 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will base our play and focus activities around retelling the stories and exploring the events and characters, and we will practice new vocabulary.

We will also use opportunities when playing outdoors to explore our how the Winter season affects our weather and environment and we will learn about ice for example. We will also look at animals that prefer this live climate, where in the world they live and share some facts about them.

Launch Day

On Monday 6th January we will be having our launch day! This is where the children are introduced to their topic in an exciting and inspirational way. The children will arrive to find a Gingerbread House and cooking equipment in class which will spark off their adventure with The Gingerbread Man.

Chinese New Year

Wednesday 29th February– Year of the Dragon! As well as learning about traditional stories and the season of Winter, our celebration this term will be Chinese New Year. We will be making 'Lucky Envelopes' and practice writing our names on them. We will also learn a Chinese song and make Dragon puppets.

<u>Books</u>

The children will continue to choose a book from our class library to take home each week. Please remember to share this book at least twice with your child and encourage them to tell you the story using the pictures and language from the story.

Topic ideas for at Home

*Read some traditional stories at home and use puppet characters to act them out (we will cut and make some on lolly sticks at Nursery). *Provide your child with a hat, gloves and warm coat for each day and discuss why they wear them. Can the children practice putting them on by themselves e.g. spreading their fingers when putting on a glove? *Go on a Winter walk and take some chilly photos of

your journey. Ask your child to retell what they did and where they went.

*Talk about ice and frost and think of lots of interesting words to describe the way it looks and feels.
